



Would you like to know a little more about where our "noisy offering" is going to go? It's going to ERAS Senior Network, and it might be an organization that you will want to get to know better.

Are you a senior citizen who could use some help with transportation to get to doctor's appointments, or the grocery store? Are you a person looking for a new way to volunteer to help others? ERAS Senior Network has a place for you!

ERAS is a nonprofit organization that originated in Waukesha County in 1981 and has worked also in Milwaukee County since 2019, when it took on the work formerly done by Greater Tosa Interfaith. They provide services to seniors to help them meet basic needs, including transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, seasonal yard clean up, and weekly wellness calls. Each year over 2,600 people are helped by ERAS in these two counties! The volunteers are so very appreciated by the clients, and the clients gain peace of mind and hope. You can volunteer whenever it is convenient, in either county, and as often as you like.

Science Tidbits

Someone Else's Waste Could Be Your Saving Grace

In my last tidbits, I discussed the importance of the gut microbiome in health and disease. I thought I'd follow that up by providing a specific example of this relationship that recently surfaced in the news involving our favorite health topic, COVID-19. As it affects just about everything else going on in our body, the microbiome also appears to influence the progression of COVID infections.

One of the most dreaded infections one can develop is *Clostridioides Difficile*, often referred to as *C diff*, a nasty, persistent antibiotic-resistant bacterium. It causes nausea, fever, stomach pain and diarrhea and can be lifethreatening if left untreated. People most susceptible are those over 65-years-old undergoing long-term antibiotic therapy, because the treatment kills the beneficial bacteria while allowing undesirable bacteria like *C diff* to flourish. The increased risk in the elderly to this, as well as other infections and diseases, is thought to be due to the shift in our microbiome composition as we age.


Gaining in popularity in battling *C diff* is the reintroduction of healthy bacteria via a fecal microbiota transfer, usually from a younger donor who presumably has a healthier microbiome. Two cases highlight this approach. In the first, an 80-year-old person with recurring *C diff* infections, accompanied by pneumonia and sepsis (overreaction of the immune system), received a stool transplant from a healthy donor. At the same time, a positive swab test revealed a COVID-19 infection. Two days later, the pneumonia had stabilized and COVID-related symptoms disappeared.

The second case involved a 19-year-old patient with recurrent *C diff* infections being treated for ulcerative colitis (chronic intestinal infection). Fifteen hours after a fecal transplant, the patient also tested positive for COVID-19. While there were two brief periods of a fever, COVID-19 symptoms soon resolved without further treatment.

These transfers had a significant positive impact on each patient's recovery from a serious *C diff* infection and is a. But important to note is the fact that, although both patients were, additionally, at risk of severe COVID-19 progression, just the opposite occurred following fecal transfer. This strongly suggests a positive therapeutic effect on the COVID-19 viral infection as well.

These exciting preliminary results indicate that a two-pronged approach to fighting COVID-19 infections, using conventional anti-viral treatments in concert with fecal transfer, may offer an even more effective option in battling these serious viral infections. During the COVID pandemic, there has been a hesitance to allow public discussion of alternative therapeutic approaches beyond the prevailing solutions proffered by the powers that be. With the impressive advances of our understanding of microbiome function, let's hope that this promising therapy will be welcomed into the public discourse, not to mention aggressively pursued in greatly expanded clinical trials. Sounds like a good idea to follow THIS science. And just think—it incurs absolutely NO cost for drug development!
