
Back-To-School Blessing

God's Work Our Hands

Station 1: Here is an opportunity to get your hands dirty! There will be a pile of potting soil, small pots and plants to put in them. These will be given to our homebound members.

Station 2: If your child likes to draw, they could include a “handwritten” note or picture with each potted plant.

Station 3: At this station, kids will assemble “Care Packages” for our Tosa Cares families including, treats, masks, and more. There are 180 bags to fill so you will be busy.

Station 4: Each Care Package will include a heart note which needs art work and a message. Art supplies will be provided.

The Middle School/High School kids will play an integral part in making the day a success by being **project leaders:** helping with set up, leading the outdoor activities, and cleaning up. A couple of youth volunteers are also needed at Tosa Cares to help carry food boxes and school supplies to Tosa Cares families who are picking up items that morning.

Our sister church, Reformation Lutheran, has asked for at least four adults, but no more than eight, for several special projects at the church. We need at least two adults who feel comfortable on ladders because we are adding string lights to the large front windows. The other projects are related to the store. Please plan to be available for about three hours. We can carpool from Mt. Zion.

And for people who want to participate, but can't leave home or are not comfortable with leaving home, there are two options:

Option 1: Sending notes of greeting to our homebound members. We will supply names and commercial greeting cards. But if you like, a note on nice stationery, a homemade card, or a drawing from a child (or an adult) are other ways to let them know Mt. Zion is thinking about them.



Option 2: Helping our Prison Ministry by writing notes to people associated with our congregation who are incarcerated. A list of names, addresses, note cards, suggested topics and return address labels with the church's address will be provided.

Challenging Times In Kenosha

On Wednesday, September 2, people from across Southwest Wisconsin gathered at Grace Lutheran Church in Kenosha Wisconsin to pray, confess, and lament in the wake of the shooting of Jacob Blake by police and the shooting of three people in the protests which followed.

Clergy, “challenged themselves to take a hard look at the conditions that were already in place, confessing to the shortcomings that as whites they must do a better job to understand the underlying racism. They stressed listening to Black clergy and community members who have lived in fear of law enforcement that are supposed to protect and serve.” ([Kenosha News, “Clergy We Must Confront Racism.”](#))

“They asked the people gathered to reflect on how they had been complicit in or benefited from systemic racism and to consider one concrete step they can take.

“Then the Rev. Kara Baylor, campus pastor at Carthage College, offered a few suggestions specifically for the white members who overwhelmingly make up the ELCA. Those suggestions included educating themselves about race and racism, joining peaceful protests and learning how systemic racism impacts policy — not all policies, but, for each person, ‘the thing you are called to do.’

And, Baylor said, ‘Be open to a change of heart.’

‘Only if we are honest about what is happening can we change the world. We are here to change the world, to change Kenosha, to change our hearts,’ she added.” (Excerpt from [Religionnews.com “Kenosha Prayer Vigil at ELCA Church”](#)).

Justice Challenge Submission

Words from St. Peter - "Cast all your anxieties on God, for God cares about you" (1 Peter 5:7). God cares! Words from Jesus - "I have compassion on the crowd ..." (Mark 8:2). Jesus had compassion!

Care and compassion. Several years ago, during another trying time of trouble and turmoil in our nation and world, there was a popular poster. On it were these words: Caution! Human Beings Here. Handle With Care!



To be cautious is to be careful: to be careful is to be full of care for ourselves and others. The opposite of being careful is being careless: that is, caring less about ourselves and others than we should be.

To be compassionate is to feel (pathos) deeply with (com) and for others. Both care and compassion are expressions of love: and the opposite of love is not hate, it is apathy (no feeling) and indifference which leads to all kinds of pain and suffering for individuals, communities and nations.

The call for care and compassion comes from many times, people, and places. It's heard from the lips and life of Jesus whose care and compassion motivated and moved him to use his power to help and to heal. The call to care is heard in the words of the philosopher Hegel who concluded: "Caring is the greatest thing. Caring matters most." The call is also heard in the words of a young woman who knew her life was ending and wrote, "The only thing that really matters is feeling and caring deeply - and living what you believe, so long as it's more than a belief about your own personal comfort." Today, who cannot hear the call for care and compassion from those suffering greatly as they feel the pain of poverty, prejudice, oppression, injustice, and illness?

Those calls need to be heard and heeded by people of faith and no religious faith, but especially by Christian people. Our identity as Christians is in our baptism and our faith and trust in the grace of God seen and shown supremely in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus; but our lives are to be characterized by our care and compassion. Our prayer needs to be that we will be among those who feel deeply, care greatly, think clearly, and act bravely so others and we may live more freely, fully and healthfully.


Mission of the Month
