#### Welcome to St. John the Evangelist.

- Following the service, please wait for the Greeter to direct your row to exit
  the church via *side* aisles to the front doors. If you entered by the back
  parking lot, you may exit via the centre aisle towards the back. Please
  sanitize your hands upon leaving.
- Cold drinks will be available on the front lawn after the service, weather permitting or in the parish hall (maximum 25 people). Please observe physical distancing while catching up with friends and neighbours. Please wear your mask unless you are sipping your lemonade!
- Please continue to be patient and kind with yourself and one another as we navigate the current "normal."

# First Reading

Numbers 21:4b-9

The people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food.' Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit

the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Christ crucified, a stumbling-block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

Deacon: The Gospel of Christ.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

#### **Presentation and Examination of Candidates**

Presider: The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Presenter: I present Isaiah Marshall John Everall to receive the

sacrament of baptism.

Presider: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present

is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Answer: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow

into the full stature of Christ?

Answer: I will, with God's help.

The presider asks the following questions of the parents and sponsors who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of

wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt

and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the

love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your

Saviour?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

The presider then addresses the congregation.

support Isaiah in his life in Christ?

People: We will.

## **Thanksgiving over the Water** (please stand)

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over

water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and forever.

Amen.

## **Baptismal Covenant**

Presider: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to

Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant. Do you

believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of

heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All:

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the

right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge

the living and the dead.

All: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,

in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

All: I will, with God's help.

Presider:

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall

into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of

God in Christ?

All: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your

neighbour as yourself?

All: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and

respect the dignity of every human being?

All: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation,

and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

All: I will, with God's help.

While the candidate moves to the baptistry, the congregation sings the following verse <u>twice</u>:

May God who creates you give you light; May God who sustains you make you wise; May God who protects you give you joy, May God who surrounds you give you peace.

The presider pours water on the candidate, saying:

Isaiah Marshall John I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own forever.

The presider prays over the newly baptized.

Presider: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy

Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant Isaiah the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the

gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.** 

## The Giving of Light

A representative from the congregation gives the newly baptized a lighted candle. The congregation is invited to stand.

Presider: Receive the light of Christ to show that you have passed

from darkness into light.

People: Let your light so shine before others that they may

see your good works and glorify your Father in

heaven.

Presider: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People: We receive you into the household of God. Confess

the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,

and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

#### The Peace

Presider: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.

Please remain in your pew during the peace. Make eye contact with your neighbour, smile behind your mask and wish them the peace of Christ.

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

**People:** We lift them to the Lord.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: Holy God, Lover of creation, we give you thanks and praise

for in the ocean of your steadfast love you bear us and place the song of your Spirit in our hearts. When we turn from your love and defile the earth, you do not abandon us. Your Spirit speaks through Huldah and Micah, through prophets, sages, and saints in every age, to confront our sin and reveal the vision of your new creation. Joining in the song of the universe we proclaim your glory saying:

All: Holy, holy, holy, Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of

the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Presider:

Gracious God, in the fullness of time you sent Jesus the Christ to share our fragile humanity. Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection you open the path from brokenness to health, from fear to trust, from pride and conceit to reverence for you. Rejected by a world that could not bear the Gospel of life, Jesus knew death was near. His head anointed for burial by an unknown woman, Jesus gathered together those who loved him. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take and eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine, gave you thanks, and said "Drink this all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." And now we gather in response to his commandment, to share the bread and cup of Christ's undying love, and to proclaim our faith.

# All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Presider:

Breathe your Holy Spirit, the wisdom of the universe, upon these gifts that we bring to you: this bread, this cup, ourselves, our souls and bodies, that we may be signs of your love for all the world and ministers of your transforming purpose. Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, Creator of all, and we bless your holy name for ever. **Amen.**
