The Proclamation of the Word

A Reading from James 3. 13-4.3, 7-8a NRSV read by Lizzie Matheson

¹³Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. ¹⁴But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. ¹⁵Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. ¹⁶For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. ¹⁷But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. ¹⁸And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for [□] those who make peace.⁵ So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. OFFICE CLOSURE

The Parish Office will be closed on **Thursday 30th September** in recognition of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Earlier this year, the federal government announced September 30 as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a new federal statutory holiday to recognize and reflect on the tragic history and ongoing legacy of residential schools.

THE LOOP SYSTEM

This hearing assistance system, installed in 2020, enables those who use hearing aids to connect directly to the sound system in the church. When the sound system is on, the Loop system is on. We ask for feedback from hearing aid users as to whether they are connecting successfully with the Loop system. Your Audiologist can tell you if your hearing devices work with a Loop system (not all do), and if so, how to connect. Please email the Wardens with your Loop experience so far at St Philip's.
