The Rector's Corner

Some Good News About St. George's Messy Outreach Work...With a Request.

When someone rings the Church's doorbell and asks if they can use the bathroom, the answer is either YES or NO. Similarly, if they ask for a drink of water, or to take a shower. In each case it is YES or NO. What underlines the 'black and white' nature of this is the fact that a real, live human being is making the request. It doesn't matter if they are dirty. It doesn't matter if they are high or strung out. They are a fellow human being and they bear the image of God.

It is interesting that the Lord Jesus made a special point of emphasizing these obligations. In talking about feeding and clothing and visiting those in need, He made it a personal thing: "I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to

Me." (St. Matthew 25. 40). That's heavy. It's direct. And, I don't want to be the one who tries to explain to the Lord why we refused to offer mercy to others.

It has been three months since we began the daily breakfast. After an intense and difficult period (which was discussed at our last Vestry Meeting), it was decided that a co-ordinator would be necessary for the work to continue, and so we all agreed to pray. Amazingly, the Lord has provided the right person AND the required funds. He has also brought an incredible group of volunteers who have a heart for our community friends. Given our current COVID-19 posture, the breakfast will be served from the elevator door as a take-out for the next 4-6 weeks; and individuals will be welcomed in to use washrooms and showers, and to access clothing.

In all of this, we need to be careful not to enable bad and destructive behaviours. This is an on-going conversation in which we have engaged the Community Policing Unit to be present at the breakfast, and to advise and assist us. As relationships grow, respect is deepening, and most of our community friends are quick to express heart-felt thanks. Still, there are occasional instances of ingratitude – but, we are working with people who lives are broken and desperate; and sometimes their frustrations come out. Nevertheless they are human beings, made in the image of God.

All that said, I am aware of the fact that some members of our own Congregation find it difficult and intimidating to come to Church, unsure of who or what they may encounter. That's a problem that requires immediate attention. A friendly volunteer 'presence' is required outside on the corner, 15 minutes before the eight o'clock and ten o'clock Sunday Services, and for a few minutes afterwards. We do not need security guards or muscle-power. We simply need some volunteers to welcome people as they arrive and to see them off when they leave. If you would be willing to help, please let me know.
