Hymns of the Faith



How Deep the Father's Love for Us (Stuart Townend, 1995)

British-born songwriter Stuart Townend's hymns such as "In Christ Alone", "How Deep the Father's Love" and "The Power of the Cross" are sung in churches around the world. The skill and depth of his lyric writing has drawn some to compare his contribution to hymnody to that of Watts and Wesley.

Aside from writing, Stuart travels around the UK and abroad, leading worship at events and performing concerts with his band. An accomplished musician, arranger and producer, he also has years of experience in teaching and training musicians who serve in local church worship.

Stuart Townend has written about Christian music: "There are probably more hymns and

worship songs being written today than in any period of church history. But relatively few will stand the test of time. And that has always been the case: for every 'Amazing Grace' or 'And Can It Be,' you can bet there are several hundred trite, interminably dull ditties that did the rounds at the time, but have now thankfully faded into blissful obscurity."

He then offers six guidelines for writing an excellent Christian song: "Study the scriptures; be poetic, not pompous; combine objective truth and subjective response; look for musical dynamics. Make every line count; prune it mercilessly."

Townend gives insight into his writing of "How Deep the Father's Love for Us": "Writing this song was an unusual experience for me. I'd already written quite a few songs for worship, but all in a more contemporary worship style, drawing from my own musical background. But I distinctly remember getting

this feeling one day that I was going to write a hymn! Now, like most people, I am familiar with hymns – they form part of my church background, and I love the truth contained in many of them. But I don't go home at the end of a busy day and put on a hymns album! So I don't think of hymns as where I'm at musically at all!

Nevertheless, I'd been meditating on the cross, and in particular what it cost the Father to give up his beloved Son to a torturous death on a cross. And what was my part in it? Not only was it my sin that put him there, but if I'd lived at that time, it would probably have been me in that crowd, shouting with everyone else 'crucify him'. It just makes his sacrifice all the more personal, all the more amazing, and all the more humbling.

As I was thinking through this, I just began to sing the melody, and it flowed in the sort of way that makes you think you've pinched it

from somewhere! So the melody was pretty instant, but the words took quite a bit of time, reworking things, trying to make every line as strong as I could."

As you sing this hymn...

...notice the series of powerful and passionate words like *vast, wretch, treasure, searing loss, ashamed, scoffers,* and *accomplished,* words not often found in hymns. These tell the story of deep love. They help us consider the awfulness of the cross and the extent of both the Father's and the Son's sacrifice.

...How do you respond? The third stanza is an expression of Galatians 6:14: "But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ". Such amazing, sacrificial love is humbling. We don't deserve it. Why did He do it? There is no answer. We can only respond with our love in return.
