



Sorrento Centre 2021 Safety Plan (September 23, 2021)

The Sorrento Centre is committed to the health and well-being of our guests, staff and neighbours. We are committed to meet and exceed public health, WorkSafeBC and other rules and guidelines. Each department (food services, housekeeping, maintenance, farm, office, programming) has its own specific plan.

British Columbia is in phase three of its Restart gradual opening plan. The four-step plan from the BC government is pasted below. Although the information below says that BC will enter phase 4 on September 7, subsequent directions have kept the province in phase three – with added regional rules and protocols.

Please observe the signs posted around the main campus and farm of the Sorrento Centre, and please follow the directions of staff.

Screening:

1. All guests will screen for symptoms before arriving. If they are feeling unwell, they will stay away and contact 8-1-1 (Healthlink BC) for medical advice.
2. All staff screen frequently for symptoms. They will not report for work if unwell. The Sorrento Centre has generous paid sick leave policies for staff.
3. All staff have been supported to be fully vaccinated. Most have received first and second dose of vaccine.
4. The Sorrento Centre encourages all guests and visitors to be fully vaccinated and we have hosted a mobile vaccination clinic from Interior Health.

Mandatory face masks:

1. Face masks are required in all indoor public spaces at the Sorrento Centre and encouraged elsewhere on our campus.

Mandatory vaccination confirmation:

1. After September 13, all guests and visitors are required to show proof of first COVID vaccination and ID for certain events and activities, as per the BC Public Health Order.
2. After October 24, all guests and visitors are required to show proof of full vaccination and ID for certain events and activities, as per the BC Public Health Order.
3. Sorrento Centre will ensure that the rules of the BC Public Health Order are applied to all appropriate events and activities.
4. BC residents must display a BC Vaccine Card for validation to participate in certain events and activities, along with ID. Non-residents must show vaccination information and ID to participate in certain events and activities, along with ID.

Contract tracing:

1. The Sorrento Centre or booking groups will ensure that the names and contact information of all guests and day-visitors is maintained in a log that will be held for at least 30 days and may be used by public health authorities for contact tracing purposes.

Risk assessment and actions:

1. We have identified areas where people gather, high-touch surfaces and situations where individuals could be close to one another – including land, buildings and vehicles. Each department has an action plan for cleaning and sanitizing.
2. Observe signs for distancing, face mask, hand hygiene and other protocols.

3. Hand sanitizing stations are located throughout the campus.
4. Face masks and hand sanitizer are available in our shop.
5. Our certified food services staff follow public health protocols for procurement, preparation and service of food, including indoor and outdoor dining. Please do not move chairs or tables as they conform to safe distancing rules.
6. Housekeeping maintains a proper schedule for cleaning and sanitizing, including high-touch areas, with approved cleaners and disinfectants.
7. Contact information for visitors (guests, contractors, staff, others) is maintained by the office and/or booking groups and held for 30 days for tracing purposes.
8. Domestic travel within Canada is permitted, though there are still some international travel restrictions. Public health rules on travel within the province, the country and internationally may change from time to time. Sorrento Centre will monitor to ensure compliance with relevant travel restrictions at registration and check-in.
9. Dining protocols have been modified as public health rules are updated. The Sorrento Centre food services staff are responsible for ensuring compliance.
10. Protocols on indoor and outdoor gatherings have been enacted at the provincial and the regional level and do change from time to time. Sorrento Centre program staff, along with responsible leaders from booking groups, will ensure compliance with the current protocols.
11. Guests who travel off campus for social, recreational or other purposes will be expected to follow Safety Plans for all places they visit. If guests travel on their own, it will be their individual responsibility to follow the plans. If guests travel as an organized group with a leader designated by the Sorrento Centre, then the guests will follow the directions of the leader.
