

Church Family,

Last Sunday we launched the **4th Quarter Challenge**—a set of three goals to help us finish this year on a strong note. Nearly 200 of you signed on the dotted line to take up this challenge, committing together to improve our Sunday morning worship attendance, our daily Bible reading, and our outreach to lost people. I’ve challenged each of you to share the gospel with one lost person. The first step to sharing is praying. Here are a few biblical examples of how to pray for your lost person.

First, pray for hearts. In Acts 16:14 the Lord opens a woman’s heart to pay attention to the gospel. Her name was Lydia. God saved her that day and she became a key member of the Philippian church. As you pray for your lost person, pray that God would open their heart to the message that Jesus saves.

Second, pray for appointments. In Acts 8 we read about a divine appointment between Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch. These two men did not know each other. They had no intentions of meeting that fateful day. Little did they know that God had scheduled for them a divine appointment. As you pray for your lost person, ask God to set up some divine appointments—those unmistakable moments when He does something only He can do.

Third, pray for boldness. It is not possible to share the gospel without boldness. Every witnessing encounter requires boldness. You may respond, “I’m not very bold.” You don’t have to be. God can be bold for you and then give you His boldness, a boldness you never knew you could have. In Acts 4:29 the early Christians prayed for boldness to speak the name of Christ. God responded by filling them with the Holy Spirit and granting them boldness. So pray for boldness and look for opportunities for the Spirit to fill you, too.

Fourth, pray for clarity. In Col. 4:3-4, Paul asked the Colossian believers to pray for him that he would make the gospel message clear as he engaged the lost people of his day. We should pray the same way. We’re not always sure what to say about God, or church, or salvation when we’re talking to unbelievers. God can help us, though! That’s why we should pray for clarity.

Fifth and finally, pray for disciples. Jesus told us to make disciples (Matt. 28:19). Whenever we share the gospel we’re either helping to make a new disciple or we’re strengthening an already established disciple. Sharing the gospel is the work of making disciples. Pray for your lost person: “God, help me to make them a disciple.”
