This group began its work with lots of reading and discussion, and soon came to the conclusion that what we're really passionate about is more than stewardship - it's continuing to build a culture of generosity at Christ's Church Cathedral. We want to be a community known far and wide for generosity in terms of our time, our skills and personal gifts, our hospitality, our respect for diversity, our care for the wider community, our patience with each other and, yes, our financial support of our church and its ministries.

So as we go forward, you'll be reading about the Cathedral's stewardship initiatives under the "Generosity Team" heading. The word cloud above this article suggests the themes that we'll be exploring in the Chronicle and elsewhere over the coming months.
