Homelessness Action Week; October 10th to 17th

The Neighbourhood Ministry was started in 2007 when a small group of concerned church members decided that they would like to support the people who are unhoused on the West Side. The response that they got from many was “there aren’t any homeless people on the Westside”. But then these same people started to look around them- there’s someone outside Shoppers on Dunbar, and at the corner of 4th and Vine etc. They realised that the issue wasn’t that there weren’t any unhoused people in our neighbourhood, it was just that they didn’t SEE them. I believe that that is the same, to a

greater or lesser degree, for all of us. As we go about our busy lives the homeless people become almost invisible and I'm sure that sometimes they feel that way too. During Homelessness Action Week take a moment to look down at the people sitting on our sidewalks, think of ways you could support our work, either as a volunteer or a contributor.

Homeless Action Week also coincides with Thanksgiving; it is a good opportunity to take a moment to be grateful for our housing and other creature comforts. Please keep our friends on the street in your thoughts and prayers.

Parish Liaison to the Westside Anglican Neighbourhood Ministry

Thank-you for Providing the Supplies for the Sept 25th Outing

Steph, Jane and Joan were joined by Karen Giesbrecht from Union Gospel Mission. In the past year representatives from the Neighbourhood Ministry have been meeting with various groups who provide food on the Westside. We are the only group who actually goes out on the streets and meets people in their own environment. Karen has always been very impressed with our work so came along to find out more about our Ministry. They all met Suzi at St. Philips and were sent out with packages (prepared by Norah), sandwiches (prepared by Katie) bananas and eggs (provided by Joanne), clothing, blankets, shoes and a phone for D. Thanks to all the parishioners who contributed to this week's donations and to Suzi for coordinating everything.

Joan said a prayer and the group headed out. Over the course of the morning they saw 20 people, many who are known to us and some new people. There was a group of six people camping under the off ramp from the Granville bridge at 7th and Fir. This is a spot where we often see small encampments but only for a short time as the police move them on. At Granville and 10th they saw two of our regulars. Jane had recently got them both the proof of vaccination document which they were very happy with. Since neither of them had a phone or access to internet, it was invaluable to them. Joan also went above and beyond our usual services. One of the guys had body lice and a cough so she went and bought him the products that he needed to treat these and went back and gave them to him later in the morning.
