For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. ## **WESTSIDE ANGLICANS NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY OVERVIEW - Rhona Thornton**

**Saturday, October 30, 2021**

Together in our time on October 30th, we will move through an overview of the Neighbourhood Ministry, the various areas of services provided to the homeless and disenfranchised members of our community and offer the opportunity to become engaged in any of the programs offered through this ministry.

Questions about how all the pieces of the ministry fit together will be explored, which includes what we can do to help folks who need care beyond the packages of food we give out every week. Trust building with our friends is an important part of our work, both in how we show up every week for them with food and clothes, but also in how we refer them to appropriate services to help them. We will cover what trust based referrals look like, and how we might make them with our friends' consent in the course of our ministry work. We will also highlight further training and support which is available to ministry volunteers throughout the year, to help give some scope to what development and support in the ministry may look like for you.

We will meet at St. Anselm's Anglican ([5210 University Blvd](#)) on October 30 from 9 am -1pm. There are planned street works that day which will close university blvd from Blanca to the church. To access the church, please use one of these two routes:

- 16th Ave to Westbrook Mall, take the first exit from the roundabout at 16th onto Wesbrook and drive towards University Blvd. Take a right on University Blvd, following until you reach the church on your right side.
- Chancellor Blvd to Wesbrook Mall, take a left at the intersection of Wesbrook and Chancellor Blvd. Drive up Wesbrook and take a left at the intersection of Wesbrook and University Blvd, following university Blvd until you reach the church on your right side.
