We are called to love, not just with our words but with our whole lives.



SUNDAY, Nov. 7th—Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well, knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come. *Readings: Isaiah 25: 6-9, Psalm 24, Revelation 21: 1-6a, John 11:32-44*

SUNDAY, November 14th—November begins with All Saints Day and ends in or near Advent, when we anticipate Christ's coming again. It is fitting, then, that the readings today tell of the final resurrection and the end time. In the turmoil of hope, fear, and disbelief that these predictions provoke in us, Hebrews sounds a note of confident trust. Christ makes a way for us where there is no way, and we walk it confidently, our hearts and bodies washed in baptismal water, trusting the one who has promised forgiveness. The more we see the last day approaching, the more important it is to meet together to provoke one another to love. *Readings: Daniel 12: 1-3, Psalm 16, Hebrews 10: 11-14 (15-18) 19-25, Mark 13: 1-8*

SUNDAY, November 21st—Even after Israel had experienced the vagaries of kings, the people still longed for a true king to set things right. He would have the king's title of Anointed One (Messiah); he would be the "one like a human being" (Son of Man) given dominion in Daniel's vision. Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love. *Readings: Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14, Psalm 93, Revelation 1:4b-8, John 18: 33-37*

SUNDAY, November 28th—Advent is about the "coming days." God's people have always lived in great expectation, but that expectation finds specific, repeated enunciation in the texts appointed for these four weeks. The ancients anticipated a "righteous Branch to spring up for David." The Thessalonians awaited "the coming of our Lord Jesus with all the saints." Jesus' contemporaries hoped for the time "to stand before the Son of Man." With them we eagerly await the coming days: another Christmas celebration, a second coming, and the advent of Christ in word and supper. *Readings: Jeremiah 33: 14-16, Psalm 25: 1-10, 1 Thessalonians 3: 9-13, Luke 21: 25-36*

Congregational Meeting- Date: 10/17/2021 Location: NHL Blanchardville Site

Minutes taken by: Tiffany Bethke, Council Secretary

Agenda: Current Financials, Stewardship, Trustee update on facilities, Communication update

Dawn Doran called the meeting to order. There were 35 members in attendance.

- Current Financials: Becky Johnson reported that as of the end of August we are behind by \$7,000. Compared to the budget we are basically within where we budgeted, other than miscellaneous other & maintenance where we under budgeted for moving Pastor Chris and for snow removal.
- Stewardship: Pastor reported that we will run a traditional 4 week program probably thru November. The theme will be on the "gift of love"
- Trustee update on facilities: Rodney Kurschner reported that the Hollandale Site basement is usable now. There is still some work to be done and funding will be needed to do so. The parsonage is sitting ok, the heating system was updated last year and some trees were removed from the parsonage thanks to some members who helped with that. The next projects will likely be done in Blanchardville.
- Communications Update: Dawn Doran reported that herself, Pastor Chris and Paul Saether met with a company out of Platteville to try and get any media suggestions regarding the technology we use at the Blanchardville Site basically summarized that if our internet connection with TDS is not strong the morning of Worship Service, it will not run as well as it could if our connection was better. In November, we plan to record the 8:30 AM Worship Service, and stream it out at 10:30 AM. If we run into technology issues, we will plan to have it up by 1:00 PM.

There were no other questions. Ron Syse made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Kaye Gilbertson. Motion carried.

Board Reports:

Board of Education report, submitted by Julie Saether.

Committee met on October 18 at 7:30 with Julie Saether and Jess Kurschner present and Pastor Chris participated via phone.

Council Meeting Minutes of New Hope Lutheran

New Hope Lutheran Council Meeting Location: Blanchardville Site Date: October 25, 2021 Minutes taken by: Tiffany Bethke, Council secretary

Attendees: Dawn Doran, Becky Johnson, Ron & Ellen Syse, Jessica Kurschner, Rodney Kurschner, Dan Hittesdorf, Kandi Lockard, Tiffany Bethke. Pastor Chris Strohm joined us via phone.

Dawn Doran called the meeting to order. A devotion was led by Pastor Chris. September meeting minutes were reviewed. Ron made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Dan Hittesdorf. Motion carried. Board report from Board of Education was reviewed. The treasurer's report was reviewed by Becky Johnson who reported that September was overall a nice giving month. Kandi had questioned how much we have currently designated for plaster as the contractor who will be doing the plaster work at Blanchardville, will cost about \$2K. At this time we have just less than \$800 designated for plaster. We've been given a bid by the plaster contractor and he is willing to give us 10% off the bid, which was originally 2K, if we have him do the work during this winter period. Currently, the funds are not quite there as we would still need \$1,050. If anyone would like to donate towards the plaster project specifically, we can get this done soon. If not, we will table this until we have the funds to do so. Tiffany suggested putting an article in the Visitor letting folks know how much money we currently have in the fund to pay for the plastering work and if folks would like to specifically donate to this project and we can obtain funds to do the work, we'll contact the contractor to let him know we'd like to be placed on his schedule. Otherwise, the item will be tabled until we have funds to complete it, as discussed at Council.

Correspondence: Thank you received from the Pec Area Elementary School for the fundraising money from the recent lemonade stands. Blanchardville Police officer sent a letter requesting funds for the "shop with a cop" happening soon. Transfers/New Members: NONE Visitors: NONE

Old Business:

• Council Elections for 2022. Nominating committee – Vicki Chrostowski, Kate Garthwaite, Pastor Chris. Julie has decided she will not be running for another term. Rodney Kurschner has agreed to run for another term. We need a deacon for a full (3) term. We will also need a Board of Education member for a full (3 year) term. Dawn will send an email out to the nomination committee with whom we are looking for and from there a meeting will be set-up.

New Business:

- Confirmands approval Drew Hendrickson & Kamdyn Kolb: Pastor Chris spoke briefly regarding the two Confirmands. Dan Hittesdorf made a motion to approve the two confirmands for affirmation of baptism. Kandi Lockard approved the motion. Motion carried.
- November Lefse sales 10% of proceeds to go? Ron Syse made a motion to split 10% of the proceeds from the November Lefse sale between the local shop with a cop and local giving trees at Farmers' Savings Bank & Woodford Bank. Rodney Kurschner seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Request from organizations (i.e., 4-h clubs, scouts, etc.) to use basement at Blanchardville Site for meetings. Council agreed, it would be ok to use this space as long as we get it on the calendar ahead of time.
- Member request to use chairs from Blanchardville Site family event outside of building. Discussed and agreed that a form should likely be formed for chair/table use. Form should specify: item being requested, how many, date requested, date item will be returned, key given, if key not returned key the door(s) would need to be rekeyed at the borrowers expense. Tiffany will create a draft form and send it to the trustees.. Tiffany will make sure there are extra keys to use or items borrowed. At both sites, the fiberglass tables do not leave building.
- Barn Service. Dawn Doran has spoken with Jean Christen about the barn service. There is hesitation in proceeding with the barn service this year for a variety of reasons. At this time Council has decided to not proceed with having a barn service this year. Next year, we will look into this to re-discuss and begin planning. Dawn Doran will reach out to Jean Christen to let her know we are not proceeding with the Barn Service for this year.
