

Vicar's Voice - November 2021 - By Vicar Sena Norton

As we continue to celebrate the roots of the Lutheran Church and those who have gone before us during All Saint's Sunday, I can't help but think about our own congregation and how we are living between our own reformation and the grief of what was. We have been so long gone from what we knew, we have lost things we never imagined we would lose, and now we are coming back to a "something" that we don't recognize, at least not yet. It isn't what was nor is it what will be, that is why I call it the **messy middle.** It just is what it is and it's very messy. Thank God for our Lutheran reformation heritage and our understanding of grace upon grace!

November also finds us working our way towards a new church year with Advent beginning on the 28th. The time of holy waiting has begun at the same time we are returning to the physical building...again! Three thoughts have been rattling around in my head during all of this: the meaning of reformation for us today, the significance of worship in our lives and how change is a paradox in and of itself.

To begin reformation means more than its root word *reform*. It also means *adaptation*, *renewal*, *holy wondering* and *holy retooling*. Martin Luther showed the church these understandings, and we as Lutherans are his namesake, but Jesus was the first reformer. During his earthly ministry Jesus walked around asking the question "oh really…could it be otherwise"? Martin asked similar questions in the 16th century. He, like Jesus, dared to say that human beings have inside of them the yearning and ability to be in relationship with God. That relationship is what matters to you, to me and to all of creation and it is the gift we receive repeatedly through our faith life. This relationship is what I hope each of us can return to as we welcome each other back to the space we have made sacred for this community.

We understand, especially post-pandemic, that worship isn't the physical church alone, we have been doing church even separated from each other. But *ohhhhhhhh* how much church together can feel connective, life giving and sacred in its own right. The sacred space of the sanctuary, the act of being in the same air, exchanging our energy, hearing each other live and in person – these are the pieces we have been lamenting for these long months away. These are the pieces we want back and what our continued attention to keeping each other as safe as possible will allow. It is my prayer that in this act of coming back together you will be reformed through the renewal of community worship and faith formation.

Reformation through adaptation and retooling is trickier and that my siblings in Christ is where we are more broadly as a community. Do you feel that too? The paradox of needs and grief of the way it was into the way it is now - that is adaptation. The gift of adaptation and retooling is that we can dream into a future moment and be a church of a new reformation. Let's be brave together and step boldly into these adaptations and retooling moments. We have the Rock of Jesus to steady our feet.

Change has come and as Lutherans that is our history. We are our best selves in that space - we are the ones who constantly say this is not *just the way it is.* I like that thought - it renews in me a sense of being connected to the real world. Maybe that is why I love that Bruce Hornsby song "The Way It Is" - take a listen and see what you think. We will continue to hear the world and others say "but that's just the way it is" - no says Bruce, no says Martin, and no says Jesus. As we move from reformation red to advent blue let's live into *Continued on page 2:*

ELCA members in more than 9,300 congregations in the United States and Caribbean give approximately \$1.75 billion in regular offering to support ELCA ministries in their local communities and worldwide. When members give through their congregations, a percentage of that money is then shared with the local synod and the national churchwide organization.

This unrestricted giving, called Mission Support, gives us both the foundation and the fuel to do God's work in the world and a portion of the gifts circle back to support ministries in synods and local congregations. Of these unrestricted gifts, the churchwide organization receives around 2.6 percent. This represents the largest portion of the ELCA churchwide organization's operating budget.



ELCA issues declaration to American Indian and Alaska Native people

As the United States paused on Oct. 11 to honor and celebrate the Indigenous people who first settled on the land thousands of years ago, the ELCA released "A Declaration of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to American Indian and Alaska Native People." The declaration is a direct result of the social policy resolution "Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery," which was passed by the 2016 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Included in the statement is a confession to American Indian and Alaskan Native communities in the ELCA and in the United States. Among other things, it confesses to treating these communities as a minority group rather than as sovereign nations and failing to do more to repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery after the formal repudiation was passed. As believers in Christ, we are called to serve our neighbors. Being prepared for emergencies allows us to be ready to served others. As the seasons change we shift from the emergency concerns of summer – wildfire – to those of winter – flooding, snow and ice. Now is a good time to sign -up for emergency alerts and refresh your emergency kit.

<u>Emergency Alerts – After signing up for emergency alerts, you will receive critical information on severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuations by your choice of text, phone or email.</u>

Recommended items:

Food (at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food)

Battery or hand crank powered radio Flas

Whistle (to signal for help)

Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place)

Manual can opener

Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery

List of financial accounts and contacts

Paper and pencil Books, games, puzzles

Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)

Mess Kits, paper plates, cups, towels, and plastic utensils

Water (1 gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation

Flashlight and extra batteries

Dust Mask (filter contaminated air)
Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)

Local maps

Medications for up to two weeks

Cash Matches

Pet food
