
Board Roles & Responsibilities

The Board of Elders and the non-Board Nominating Committee members are elected by the membership of Tenth Church. Voting will take place only at the AGM on November 28, 2021.

A general forum regarding the overall operation and vision of Tenth will be held online from 1:00-2:30pm.

The overall mandate for the Board of Elders is to govern on behalf of the people of Tenth Church. Specifically, it is the responsibility of each board member to uphold and support the teaching of the Word of God and to model Christ-like behaviour. The Board also oversees the material needs of the church by creating a framework that assures adequate resources (personnel, facilities, financial) and safeguarding of assets and financial resources. It is the Board's responsibility to select the Senior Pastor in cooperation with the C & MA District Office and to support the Senior Pastor after they are hired. Also, the Board advises the Nominating Committee in the recruitment of Board members.

Darryl Shoemaker


