

## A Message from Archbishop Lynne...

Dear People of the Territory,

Last weekend I led a retreat at Sorrento Centre using Hildegard of Bingen as our guide for spiritual sustenance. The reason I chose this twelfth century mystic, a Benedictine Abbess and “Doctor of the Church,” is she embodies a life-giving spirituality and relationship with Creation and Creator that is inspiring for our time. Bold and feisty, an activist who wrote to popes and princes to address issues of peace, social justice and reform of the Church, an artist who composed symphonies, a botanist, herbalist and medical practitioner, she saw Creation and our Bodies as good gifts of God to be treasured and kept well.

Hildegard saw human beings as co-Creators with God, with a vocation to care for other creatures and the Earth. She calls us into a joyous relationship with the Earth, a falling in love with Earth that undergirds our call to care for this gift of God. Hildegard experienced the feminine nature of God. She spoke of Viriditas, the greening power or creative life force in all things.

A few quotes from Hildegard for your meditation:

- \* *Don't let yourself forget that God's grace rewards not only those who never slip, but also those who bend and fall. So sing! The song of rejoicing softens hard hearts. It makes tears of godly sorrow flow from them. Singing summons the Holy Spirit. Happy praises offered in simplicity and love lead the faithful to complete harmony, without discord. Don't stop singing.*
- \* *The mystery of God hugs you in its all-encompassing arms.*
- \* *Glance at the sun. See the moon and the stars.  
Gaze at the beauty of earth's greenings.*
- \* *We shall awaken from our dullness and rise vigorously toward justice.  
If we fall in love with creation deeper and deeper, we will respond to its endangerment with passion.*
- \* *Even in a world that's being shipwrecked, remain brave and strong.*
- \* *The marvels of God are not brought forth from one's self. Rather, it is more like a chord, a sound that is played. The tone does not come out of the chord itself, but rather, through the touch of the musician. I am, of course, the lyre and harp of God's kindness.*
- \* *Every creature is a glittering, glistening mirror of Divinity*
- \* *God be praised in God's handiwork: Humankind*
- \* *And so, Humanity - full of all creative possibilities, is God's work.  
Humanity is called to assist God. Humanity is called to co-create.*

May Hildegard's words strengthen you in your high calling of assisting God in the care of Creation.

### Territory News:

- ∞ **The Annual General Meeting** of the Territory of the People was held on Friday October 15<sup>th</sup> and the following Directors were elected: Bishop: Archbishop Lynne McNaughton; Financial Officer: The Rev Canon Len Fraser; Clergy Secretary: The Rev Jo Ann Hinter; Lay Secretary: Denise Boulanger; Director: Pastoral Elder Amy Charlie.
- ∞ An extraordinary meeting of **Coordinating Council** was held on October 15, 2021 where motions were carried regarding:
  - Clerical and Lay Secretaries gave notice to the Metropolitan of the Ecclesiastical Province of British Columbia and Yukon, the desire of the Territory of the People to hold an Episcopal Election, and requested the Metropolitan to determine an Episcopal Election may be held.
  - The Metropolitan in consultation with the Coordinating Council, strike a Provincial Validation Committee to evaluate the viability of the Territory of the People and make a recommendation whether to proceed with an Episcopal Election, or recommend an alternate method of episcopal oversight.
  - The Coordinating Council appoint an Electoral Committee consisting of members as outlined in Territory policy 1.11.(7)

## Territory News, continued...

- ∞ **Regional Gatherings** - On Saturday October 16<sup>th</sup> 2021 three Regional Gatherings were held in the Regional Deaneries: South Rivers - Ashcroft, led by the Rev Angus Muir; Cariboo - Quesnel, led by the Rev Jo Ann Hinter; Kamloops at St. Paul's Cathedral led by Archbishop Lynne McNaughton and the Rev Canon Len Fraser. All elected Assembly delegates were invited to attend, as well as others from the parishes, either in person or from home. The Territory broadcast a live stream of the proceedings from St. Paul's Cathedral, Kamloops, as well as a Zoom video meeting to enable all participants to participate in small group discussions throughout the day. The theme of the day was: "*Come and Find a Quiet Centre*".

The message from scripture, Isaiah 30:15 - "*In quietness and in trust shall be your strength*". Guest speakers included National Indigenous Archbishop Mark MacDonald and Bishop Mary Irwin Gibson from our companion Diocese of Montreal. During the day, Archbishop Lynne posed questions for the small groups to discuss and record their responses:

- Who are we?
- What have we learned from this experience?
- What reshaping or changing do we need to work on as the Territory because of what we have learned?
- What are our next steps? What does God call us to do now?

The responses from these questions have been collated and will shortly be posted on the Territory website. The information will be invaluable to us all as we move ahead.

On Sunday morning, all parishes and people of the Territory were invited to attend in person or virtually, a Territory worship service which was also live-streamed, with Archbishop Mark presiding and Archbishop Lynne preaching.

- \* A beautiful Mohawk Blanket presented to The Rev Canon Captain Isabel Healy Morrow for Isabel's work as Chair of the Territory Companion Relationship Committee since its inception in 2008, and her untiring work with the Montreal Partnership Committee.
- \* An exquisite silver engraved pyx to the Rev Linda LaGroix, Deacon as the newest and recently ordained clergy person in the Territory.

- ⌘ **Territory Administrator** – At the Administration Committee held on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, Archbishop Lynne McNaughton announced her appointment of the Rev Canon Len Fraser as Administrator for the Territory of the People. Len will work with the Bishop’s Circle (Bishop Barbara, Bishop Gordon and Archbishop Lynne) providing oversight for all things episcopal, the Financial Committee and current administration, to provide leadership to the Territory during this transition time in the Territory.
- ⌘ **COVID-19: Update** – as many of you are aware, BC Provincial guidelines dictate the changing nature of restrictions as the province sees waves of Covid resurging in some areas. The Territory Re-Opening Plan with suggested protocols for all Territory parishes has been published as a News item on the Territory website, found [here](#). Provincial guidelines supersede the Territory Plan and you are encouraged to be informed as to restrictions in your local area.
