Bible Study

For Study through the Week – October 31, 2021

Genesis 3:1-7

1. Today we want to look at the first sin and the temptation that brought Adam and Eve to sin. Reread God's prohibition in Genesis 2:16-17, in addition to Genesis 3:1-7.

Look at the serpent's question in verse 3:1. What does he deny to tempt Eve?

2. Compare 3:2-3 with 2:16-17. There are 3 differences. a) Eve does not mention that they can eat of every tree in the garden, except one; b) she adds that they may not touch the fruit; and c) she does not say that they shall surely die.

How do we see Eve's already losing faith in God's word and promises to them?

3. Describe the temptation of Genesis 3:4-5. Why is this temptation so similar to all other temptations we might face?
4. Describe the movement of Eve into sin from 3:6. How does James 1:14-15 describe temptation? How is Eve's giving into temptation so similar to the way we give in?

5. Where do you think Adam was? What should he have been doing (Genesis 2:15)? Eve was supposed to be his helper. How did both fail their responsibilities?

6. Adam's sin, not Eve's, is what plunged humanity into darkness. What does Romans 5:12, 17-19 say happened as a result of this sin? What does it say about our hope?

7. How did Jesus resist temptation (Luke 4:1-12)? What is important for us in order to faithfully obey God in the face of temptation?

Pray that God would give you a growing love for Him that is able, by His grace, to resist temptation.
