PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-9

Isaiah sees a vision of the end of days when God will prepare for all people a rich feast. At this banquet God will wipe the tears from all eyes, for God will destroy death itself.

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear.

And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death forever.

Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. Second Reading: Revelation 21:1-6a

Here is a vision of the new heaven and new earth in which God resides fully with God's people so that mourning, despair, and pain have been eradicated.

I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

“See, the home of God is among mortals.

He will dwell with them;
they will be his peoples,
and God himself will be with them;
he will wipe every tear from their eyes.

Death will be no more;
mourning and crying and pain will be no more,
for the first things have passed away.”

And the one who was seated on the throne said, “See, I am making all things new.” Also he said, “Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.”

Then he said to me, “It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end.”

Gospel Reading: John 11:32-44

Through the raising of Lazarus, Jesus offers the world a vision of the life to come, when death and weeping will be no more.

Christ according to John.

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?"

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upward and said, "Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me."

When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

People: **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**



Presenters: Sarah and Shaun (parents); Claire (sister); Bonnie and Nairn (grandparents); Dominique (godmother).

Presider: From the founding of the Church
believers have been received by baptism.
Believers' children have also been baptized.
With the help and encouragement of the whole
community, we grow up knowing God's love,
hope, and forgiveness.

The Presentation for Baptism

Presider: God is love, God gives life.
In baptism God declares that love,
and God calls us to respond freely.

Presenters: We present Jamie to be
baptised and made a member of the
Body of Christ, the Church.

Presider: Will you by your prayers and witness
support Jamie to continue to follow
the way of Christ?

Presenters: We will with God's help

Presider: Do each of you strive for peace
and justice and share God's love in our
world?

Presenters: We do.

Presider: Do you follow the Way that brings forgiveness, freedom and life?

Presenters: We do.

The Response of the Community

Presider: We now ask this community, the body of Christ, for your support and care. Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Jamie in Christ?

Community: We agree to support Jamie through our prayers and actions.

Prayers for Jamie:

Bonnie: Let us now pray for Jamie who is to receive the sacrament of baptism. In the transforming waters of baptism, your son, Jesus, embraced his mission.

Nairn: Loving God, creator of living waters, help Jamie, to walk in the ways of goodness and new life. Open his heart to your wisdom and grace.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Bonnie: Pour your grace upon this community of faith. Help us walk with Jamie, in the ways of your love and compassion, help us to foster and nourish the gifts that you have planted within him.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Nairn: Through baptism, we agree to do all in our power to discern with Jamie,
as he chooses
Good over Evil,
Love over Hate,
Hope over Despair.

All: Through baptism we recognize the freedom and light Christ brings. We promise to show Jamie our care, to support his spiritual journey and to provide a place to go in times of difficulty. Amen.

The Baptismal Covenant

Presider: Now we recall our faith.
 We believe in God the Creator.

**All: In the silence and the secret of our
 hearts we believe in God,
 father and mother of us all,
 even though there is evil and suffering,
 even though it is sometimes difficult to
 believe,
 we believe God created our world
 and we are called to be co-creators of
 happiness and new life.**

Presider: We believe in Jesus Christ, Son of God.

**All: We believe in Jesus
 who lived among us,
 caring for the world,
 and healing the sick.**

All: He calls us to love, share and forgive, as we try to follow his footsteps.

Presider: We believe in God the Holy Spirit.

All: We believe in the Spirit of peace and reconciliation.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayer?

All: We will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All: We will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?


All: We will, with God's help.

Thanksgiving over the water

Water is poured into the font.

Presider: At the beginning of time,
you blessed Mother earth with water.

Presider: We sign you with the cross and mark you as Christ's own forever.

Light

Jamie is presented with a lit candle.

Dominique: Walk in the faith of Christ
 crucified and risen.
 Shine with the light of Christ

All: The light of Christ is in our midst.

Dominique: Here is a candle to keep as you
 grow, to light at each stepping
 stone of your life so as to remind
 you of your baptism.

**All: Receive the light of Christ!
 In joy we welcome you to this
 community of faith.**

Presider: Therefore, with angels and
 archangels and with all who have
 served you in every age,
 we raise our voices to proclaim the
 glory of your name.
