The Call Committee consists of seven people from across the congregation who will pray and discern God's will as they work with the Synod to prepare call paperwork, review profiles of potential pastors, conduct interviews, and ultimately decide who will be our next Associate Pastor.

The nomination period is open until November 15th. Submit a nomination for yourself or some-one else either online at ctkb.org/call-committee or by placing a written nomination in the yellow nominations box which is located in the Narthex. The Council will appoint the members of the Call Committee during their November meeting.

Together at the Table Campaign

"Thus you will eat and drink at my table in my kingdom." -Luke 22:30 Jesus promises to his followers that they will have a place together with him in the eternal kingdom of Heaven. As a faith community, we get to be a foretaste of that kingdom as we come together with one another around the table here and now! Our 2022 Stewardship Campaign Goal is to increase our giving by \$30,000 or more in new or increased offerings in 2022. Our Priorities:

- 1. A Table of Care. +\$15k for Great Interim Pastors so nobody falls through the cracks in this time of transition.**
- 2. A Table of Belonging. +\$5k to increase capacity to care and welcome the most vulnerable through education and hands-on work.**
- 3. A Table for the Neighborhood. +\$10k for new bi-monthly fellowship events: cookouts, live music, outdoor festivals**
