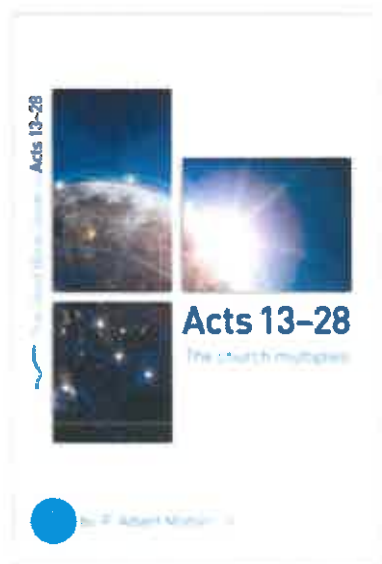

Bible Study

For Study through the Week – November 7, 2021

Genesis 3:8-13

Big Idea: How should we deal with sin and mistakes?

1. Do you have an embarrassing moment? What made you feel so embarrassed in it?
2. Reread Genesis 3:1-7. What was the first result of Adam and Eve's sin (verse 7)? How was this different than how they were created (Genesis 2:25)?
3. What was the second thing they did (Genesis 3:8)? Can you think of some reasons they might have done this?
4. Notice they used God's creation to hide from God. Can you think of some ways people still use God's creation to hide from Him?
5. God calls out to Adam in verse 9. How does this show us God's grace? How could he have responded more harshly?

6. In verse 10, Adam identifies a new emotional experience – FEAR. In what ways does sin create fear?

7. What is the third way Adam tried to hide (or minimize) his sin in verse 12? Why do we use blame? How does blaming others hurt us? How does it hurt others?

8. How did Adam blame God in verse 12? How is his attitude towards God's gifts different than what we saw in Genesis 2:23?

9. Think about the ways that Jesus did the opposite of Adam in taking responsibility:
 - a) Instead of covering Himself with fig leaves, what did Jesus do? (Genesis 3:21; John 19:23-24; 2 Corinthians 5:2-3, 21; Isaiah 61:10)

 - b) Instead of hiding from God, what did Jesus do? (Luke 22:41-42)

 - c) Instead of blaming others, or God, what did Jesus do? (1 Peter 3:18; Romans 5:8)

presented Myself an offering to expiate your sin,
shed My blood to blot out your guilt,
opened My side to make you clean,
endured your curses to set you free,
bore your condemnation to satisfy divine justice.'

O may I rightly grasp the breadth and length of this design,
draw near, obey, extend the hand, take the bread,
receive the cup, eat and drink,
testify before all men that I do for myself,
gladly, in faith, reverence and love, receive my Lord,
to be my life, strength, nourishment, joy, delight.

In the supper I remember His eternal love, boundless grace,
infinite compassion, agony, cross, redemption,
and receive assurance of pardon, adoption, life, glory.

As the outward elements nourish my body,
so may Thy indwelling Spirit invigorate my soul
until that day when I hunger and thirst no more, and sit with Jesus at His heavenly feast



PARTICIPATING IN THE LORD'S SUPPER

1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-34

The Lord Supper: also commonly called "communion," is a sacrament where Christ is spiritually present, offering us His body and blood to nourish our faith. As we eat, we participate in His death and resurrection and the sacrament acts as a means of grace to build us up in faith.

We welcome all who have professed faith in Jesus Christ, been baptized, have been admitted to the table, and are genuinely seeking to live a godly life. If that doesn't describe you, we ask that you not participate. However, please come and speak to a pastor or an elder if you desire to be baptized or participate in the future.

If you do not participate, you can use the prayers below during this time of quiet receiving. If you do receive the sacraments, you can meditate on the love of Jesus Christ for you. Consider the prayer on the other side of this sheet to help you think of His grace.

Today, we will distribute the bread and the cup separately to you in your seats. We will eat the bread together and then we will drink the cup together. The bread is gluten free. The cup has grape juice.

Prayer for Those Searching for Truth

Lord Jesus, You claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following You as I consider the reasons for doing so. If what You claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who You are. Give me an understanding of You that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that You promise. Amen.

Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through You I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank You for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that You have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive You as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Those Struggling with Sin

Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in You the fulfillment of all my need, and may turn from every false satisfaction to feed on You, the true and living bread. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely, and run with perseverance the race set before me, looking to You, the pioneer and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

Prayer of Commitment

Lord Jesus, You have called us to follow You in baptism and a life of committed discipleship in Your church. Grant that I may take the necessary steps to be one with Your people, and live in the fullness of Your Spirit. Amen.
