ORIGIN STORIES - Part 3

"What is Sin?"

So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.

- Genesis 3:6

Big Idea: At its core, sin is disobedience, a desire to live our lives the way we want to apart from God.

For the sinful nature is always hostile to God. It never did obey God's laws, and it never will. That's why those who are still under the control of their sinful nature can never please God. - Romans 8:7-8 NLT

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

1. Sin is destructive and leads to death (physical and spiritual).

Don't be misled—you cannot mock the justice of God. You will always harvest what you plant. Those who live only to satisfy their own sinful nature will harvest decay and death from that sinful nature. But those who live to please the Spirit will harvest everlasting life from the Spirit. - Galatians 6:7-8 NLT

When Adam sinned, sin entered the world. Adam's sin brought death, so death spread to everyone, for everyone sinned. - Romans 5:12 NLT

2. Jesus paid the ultimate price for our sins so that we might live.

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. - 1 Peter 2:24
