## THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

#### **EXODUS CHAPTER 20**

## THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Then God spoke all these words:

- 2 I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the place of slavery.
- 3 Do not have other gods besides me.
- 4 Do not make an idol for yourself, whether in the shape of anything in the heavens above or on the earth below or in the waters under the earth. 5 Do not bow in worship to them, and do not serve them; for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, bringing the consequences of the fathers' iniquity on the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate me, 6 but showing faithful love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commands.

7 Do not misuse the name of the Lord your God, because the Lord will not leave anyone unpunished who misuses his name.

8 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy: 9 You are to labor six days and do all your work, 10 but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. You must not do any work — you, your son or daughter, your male or female servant, your livestock, or the resident alien who is within your city gates. 11 For the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and everything in them in six days; then he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and declared it holy.

- 12 Honor your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God is giving you.
- 13 Do not murder.
- 14 Do not commit adultery.
- 15 Do not steal.
- 16 Do not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- 17 Do not covet your neighbor's house. Do not covet your neighbor's wife, his male or female servant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

#### THE PEOPLE'S REACTION

18 All the people witnessed the thunder and lightning, the sound of the ram's horn, and the mountain surrounded by smoke. When the people saw it they trembled and stood at a distance. 19 "You speak to us, and we will listen," they said to Moses, "but don't let God speak to us, or we will die."

20 Moses responded to the people, "Don't be afraid, for God has come to test you, so that you will fear him and will not sin." 21 And the people remained standing at a distance as Moses approached the total darkness where God was.

## MOSES RECEIVES ADDITIONAL LAWS

22 Then the Lord told Moses, "This is what you are to say to the Israelites: You have seen that I have spoken to you from heaven. 23 Do not make gods of silver to rival me; do not make gods of gold for yourselves.

24 "Make an earthen altar for me, and sacrifice on it your burnt offerings and fellowship offerings, your flocks and herds. I will come to you and bless you in every place where I cause my name to be remembered. 25 If you make a stone altar for me, do not build it out of cut stones. If you use your chisel on it, you will defile it. 26 Do not go up to my altar on steps, so that your nakedness is not exposed on it. -- Exodus 20:1-26 (CSB)

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. How many of the Ten Commandments do you know? Beyond memorizing them, how else can they be made profitable?
- 2. How are God's holiness and grace demonstrated in His giving Israel the Ten Words? Why is it important to remember that God delivered Israel from slavery first, then gave the Ten Words?
- 3. What is the connection between God saying, "All the earth is Mine," and our status as a "kingdom of priests"? What is our mandate?
- 4. How does obedience to the four "vertical" commands cause a person to obey the six "horizontal" commands? That is, how does the first "greatest command" give rise to the second?
- 5. How does the first command address atheism, agnosticism, and idolatry? What do people in your culture tend to worship, and how do they express that worship?
- 6. How is jealousy a virtue in God but generally a vice in humans? Why is it good for God to demand His own worship and defend His own glory?
- 7. How does human pride subvert each of the commands? How are coveting and stealing related to the first command?
- 8. How do you observe your Sabbath? Which receives more time and emphasis: rest or worship?
- 9. Why is it not always helpful to distinguish moral law, civil law, and ceremonial law? Which category does each of the Ten Words fall in?
- 10.`Why does the perfect righteousness incorporated in the Ten Words cause people to lose hope? What restores that hope?[1]

## Prison Fellowship Angel Tree

Prison fellowship brings together volunteer criminal, victim and donor, family and church member, sinner and saint all under the one tent.

Prison fellowship has been running the Angel Tree program for over 30 years. This program offers parents in prison a gift to be sent to their child, on their behalf at Christmas time.

Last week we received this letter from a person in prison here in Victoria.

I have been informed about a program that your organisation runs called 'Angel Tree' whereby you can help the children of prisoners receive a present at Christmas time. Having experienced my first Christmas in prison last year I found it the most difficult, upsetting and challenging time of my life as I couldn't be there with my children or even provide them a gift to celebrate this time of the year. I was raised in a home where Christmas was valued as the most special and magical time of the year. To be absent from my family and unable to even send my children a Christmas gift last year ripped my heart out. When I heard about this program that you provide, I thought that I would write and see if you could include me so I may be able to give something to my kids this Christmas. I love and miss my family so much that it hurts and it broke my heart to see the sadness in their eyes during the video visit and hear the disappointment in their voices on the telephone calls, when I couldn't share Christmas with them last year. I think that being part of this program would go some way towards alleviating a little of that.

I thank you and your organisation for the support that you provide to prisoners and their families.

## How can you help?

By donating as you are able too, to the Angel Tree appeal. \$30.00 is for the gift and \$10.00 for wrapping and postage. In past years gifts have been delivered in person.

Victoria's Equal Opportunity (Religious Exceptions) Amendment Bill 2021 will be debated in the Legislative Assembly next week. Under this bill, if a non-ordained church staff member or a teacher in a Christian school has an extramarital affair or lives in a relationship which is considered by law to be "lawful sexual behaviour" there can be no discipline or refusal to hire such people to work in Churches or Christian Schools. This means that biblical principles would no longer be able to be applied to people applying for or engaged in employment with a Christian employee. Please pray for the defeat of this bill in both Houses of the Victorian Parliament.

Please continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in North Korea. North Korea's communist dictatorship has been deploying factions within the regime to carry out wrongful arrests, torture, executions and the denial of fundamental religious freedom rights as it seeks to "exterminate all Christian adherents and institutions," the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) says in a report. In its report, USCIRF says the violations it documented "are seemingly designed to remove all traces of Christianity." "The campaign to exterminate all Christian adherents and institutions in North Korea has been brutally effective and continues through the work of the Ministry of State Security, networks of informants that stretch into China, the presence of political prison camps, executions, and an educational system that deters adherence through schools, workplaces, and neighbourhoods," says the report.

The freedoms in North Korea are "subordinate to and overruled by a document known as the Ten Principles for Establishing a Monolithic Leadership System," which has as its purpose to bring each North Korean individual's thoughts and acts in line with the teachings of Kim II Sung, Kim Jong II, and Kim Jong Un, it says. USCIRF also found that the Workers' Party of Korea maintains church buildings in Pyongyang, and "it instructs a small group of approved specialized cadres to perform Christian ceremonies in these buildings, while at the same time forbidding North Korean citizens, including that group of specialized cadres, to live as Christians." North Koreans experience the denial of the right to religious freedom from birth, the report reveals.

"School lessons and movies feature missionaries," a North Korean citizen is quoted as saying. "There is actually a movie titled 'The Missionary.' The movie features an American missionary who came to Korea during the Japanese colonial occupation period and swindled children after pretending to care about them. After people watched the movie, they developed a negative impression of the missionaries on an intuitive level. People even use the word 'missionary' as a curse word." Another citizen was quoted as saying, "There was a separate subject that completely demonized the missionaries. The very purpose of that subject was to stress how horrible the missionaries are and how horrible religion and the practice of superstition is." USCIRF says it also "documented credible accounts of the execution of Christian adherents."

"Kwon Eun Som and her grandchild were executed in July 2011 in Onsong County, with only a few law enforcement officials present to witness the event," the report adds. "The execution by firing squad took place outside Hajong-ri in Onsong County. It was overseen by Onsong Ministry of State Security branch personnel, acting on the authority of the Ministry of State Security." The report also identifies 68 cases of the state prosecuting individuals for their religious belief or for their association with religious persons. "Being discovered as a Christian is a death sentence in North Korea," says Open Doors, adding, "If you aren't killed instantly, you will be taken to a labour camp as a political criminal." North Korea's dictator Kim Jong Un is reported to have expanded the system of prison camps, in which an estimated 50,000-70,000 Christians are imprisoned.
