"Origins: The Source of Our Difficulties" Genesis 3:14-24

Life is full of difficulties. Why? The introduction of sin also introduced great difficulty into the world. It's part of God's imposed consequences for sin. While we can't choose the consequences for our actions, we can choose our actions. The curse of sin has already entered our world, which must change our expectations of life in this world. Should we expect an easy life in a world so deeply affected with sin and curse? We will all face difficulty. Let's look at five consequences of sin coming into the world.

The strongest desire of the human heart, since the fall, is to be restored to the garden, but the sinful rebellion of the human heart makes it impossible to accept the path God accepts. That is why we have so many alternative visions of the "good life" – people trying to get to paradise without God. We need a new heart that accepts God's path to eternal life.

And when we accept that, we learn that sin's consequences are brutal, but God's grace is greater.
