November is Make a Will Month! Ontario trusts and estates lawyers explain the importance of wills and powers of attorney on Zoom, and what to keep in mind when preparing your own estate and care plan.

Area lawyers who practice Trusts and Estate Law will speak about the elements of a will; what happens if you don't have one; what are powers of attorney and why they are important; and special considerations to keep in mind when preparing your estate and care plans.
