

Bible Study

For Study through the Week - November 14, 2021

Genesis 3:14-24

BIG IDEA: Mankind's desire, since the Fall, is to get back to the garden. God has made a way to get back into relationship with Him, but many refuse His way.

- 1. What difficulties do you face in your work? What are some of the biggest challenges with having children?
- 2. What judgment does God give the devil in Genesis 3:15?

How was this fulfilled according to Hebrews 2:14-15?

What part do we have in it, according to Romans 16:20?

3. Marriage: what marriage and family challenges do we see in Genesis 3:16?

To understand "your desire shall be contrary to your husband" (ESV of 3:16), we can compare Genesis 4:7 and sin's desire to overcome Cain. It's the same phrase. How does Eve's desire subvert God's creative design according to Genesis 3:18?

How will the man treat the woman, according to Genesis 3:16? How is this different than God's plan in 2:23-25?

How do we see these challenges in marriage today?

4.	What happens between Adam and Eve in verse 20? How do we see Adam's authority, his faith, and his blessing to Eve?
5.	Work: what does God say about Adam's work in Genesis 3:17-19? What does Romans 8:19-22 add about this judgment?
	How do we experience the futility of work in this world?
6.	How do we see God's grace in Genesis 3:21? Compare what Adam and Eve did in 3:7. How are God's methods of restoration always better than our attempts?
7.	In Genesis 3:22-24, God sends Adam and Eve out of the garden. Where is the tree of life now (Revelation 2:7)? How do we have access to it (Revelation 22:14)?
	Since the expulsion from the garden, how has man tried to get back with God (Ephesians 2:8-9)? Why are his personal efforts fruitless? How do you see this restlessness? How has knowing God made you feel like you are "home"?
