

Advent means "coming" or "arrival." It is a season marked by expectation, longing, and hope. In the Christian calendar Advent is the beginning of the year; it is a new season of waiting on God and waiting for the Messiah.

During this time we feel the pressing in of darkness, the weight of time passing, and the loneliness of inaction. And yet, we also feel God preparing to do something new. We know God is coming in Jesus and our longing is filled with hope, our expectation with reality, and our waiting with barely bridled joy.

In Advent we join with ancient Israel in waiting for the Messiah and the hope, faith, joy, and peace he will bring. Even as we reflect back on the anticipation of Israel for her king, we are also looking forward to when our King, Jesus, will return.



Now to Use this Booklet

The main intention of the booklet is to provide a liturgy for each week of Advent. The liturgy can be found on pages 7-15. With this you will be able to follow along with our online services. You are encouraged to read through it beforehand and assign readers – feel free to be creative for your household depending on reading ability.

There are 3 readers listed. Reader 1 will be on screen, readers 2 and 3 will be in your home. If your household has children that are newer to reading we recommend giving them reader 3 as they have less challenging lines. If there is just 1 of you, assign double readings.



Step

Candles and Ribbon

Gather 5 candles and wrap ribbon around the bottom: 3 purple ribbons, 1 pink ribbon, 1 white ribbon. Be careful of fire hazards (consider using coloured candles).

Wood Base and Candle Placing

Place wood base somewhere sturdy and arrange the candles on it with the white ribbon in the centre. For extra stability, fix them to the wood with glue.

Add Greenery

Add evergreen trimmings and other Christmas greenery.




Add Decoration

Be creative and individualize your household wreath with your own decorations.







CANDLES | Candles are symbols of pushing back the gathering darkness. The contrast of light and darkness is common throughout the Bible (cf. Gen. 1:1-5; Ps. 27; Is. 9 & 11, 59 & 60; Jn. 1; Rev. 21 & 22)

COLOURS | The different colours of the candles carry symbolism.



Purple | Most advent traditions have purple candles because it is a colour that signifies royalty of the coming King.

Pink/Rose | This candle is lit on the third Sunday, a time of joy.

White | The centre candle, the Christ candle, is always white. It signifies the purity and light of Christ.

The prophet Micah is writing in Israel as society is falling apart, religion is being used as an excuse for power, and the leaders have forgotten the Lord. Israel stands on the cusp of the exile and Micah prophesies the coming kingdom of God. It is in Micah that we learn the Messiah King will be born in Bethlehem (5:2).

In this season of expectation, Micah writes, "But as for me, I will look to the Lord; I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me." (Micah 7:7, ESV) As Christians we know Jesus has come and he is coming again; and so, we live in light of that truth.

We live in faith that he is powerful and redeemer; we live out of a confidence and security of being a child of God, citizen of the kingdom come and kingdom coming; and we live full of heavenly purpose to reveal the gospel of Jesus to the whole world.

While we wait *for* the Lord, we wait *upon* the Lord, and we wait *in* the Lord.

READER 3 | We live and wait in hope that our king has come.






LEADER | "He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3)

READER 3 | Faith is receiving and resting on Jesus alone for salvation as he is offered to me in the gospel.

LEADER | The season of Advent is filled with waiting. As we wait, we feel the pressing in of darkness, the weight of time passing, and the loneliness of inaction. And yet, we also feel God preparing to do something new. We know God is coming in Jesus and our longing is filled with patience, our expectation with reality, and our waiting with barely bridled *joy*.

READER 2 | While we wait for the Lord, we wait upon the Lord, and we wait in the Lord. Jesus has come and he is coming again; and so, we live and work and play in the sure promises of God.

READER 3 | We live and wait with joy because of what Jesus has done.

LEADER | "Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12: 1-2)

READER 2 | We light this candle as a reminder our joy comes fully in relationship to Jesus [light the 3rd candle]. Therefore we can endure any trial, struggle, and suffering because Jesus has overcome the world.

READER 3 | Faith is receiving and resting on Jesus alone for salvation as he is offered to me in the gospel.

LEADER | "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (Jn. 14:27)

READER 2 | We light this candle as a sign that the rule and reign of Jesus extends to the ends of the earth [light the 4th candle]. By the love of God we are restored to wholeness, filled with purpose and learning contentment.

READER 3 | I belong to Jesus. He promises I will live with him forever and he makes me ready and willing, with all my heart, strength, and soul to live for him from now on.

LEADER | Joy to the world! The Lord is come! Let earth receive her king!


ALL "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." (Luke 2:14).
