9.00 AM THE CATHEDRAL BELL RINGERS

The Christ Church Cathedral Guild of Bell Ringers was established in 1936 to ring the then new bells, cast at the White-chapel Bell Foundry in London, for Sunday services, weddings, funerals, and civic and national occasions. Originally, eight bells were installed, subsequently augmented to ten in 1983. The installation is designed for English Change Ringing, a tradition developed in the sixteenth century as a way of creating musical sequences from an "instrument" (the peal of bells) limited in its manipulation and number of notes. This unique tradition (which is strongly associated with Anglicanism) is maintained by the current band, a majority of whom are locally trained.

9.30 AM STUDENTS OF THE VICTORIA ORGAN STUDIO

The Victoria Organ Studio was founded in 2021 to give local organ students a chance to participate in regular master-classes and to connect with other students. Today's performers include Jorge Flores Carrizales, student of Donald Hunt and Mark McDonald and former organ scholar at Christ Church Cathedral, Emily Markwart, student of David Stratkauskas and organ scholar at the Church of St John the Divine, Amiel Elfert, student of Mark McDonald at the University of Victoria, and organ scholar at Christ Church Cathedral, and Robert Dukarm, student of Mark McDonald and former assistant organist at Christ Church Cathedral.

12.30 PM ROSS BLISS, GUITARIST AND BOB FRASER, TROMBONIST

Robert Fraser (goes by "Bob") is the bass trombonist in the Victoria Symphony, a position he has held since 1990. He has also performed with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, the Vancouver Island Symphony Orchestra, and the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra. An avid chorister since childhood, Bob has sung with the Cathedral Choir since moving to Victoria - he is a founding chorister of the St Christopher Singers here at the Cathedral. and has sung with the Vox Humana Chamber Choir since 2002.

Ross Bliss majored in Jazz Studies at Capilano University and has played at festivals and venues in Winnipeg and Vancouver. In addition to mainstream jazz and blues, he continues to work at Gypsy Jazz both as a genre and as an ingredient. The late Pat Martino is his main inspiration and influence.

1.00 PM COOKEILIDH

Cookeilidh has been delighting audiences for over 12 years with their high energy traditional, and modernized Celtic tunes. Comprised of 12 string guitar, fiddle, Irish flute, electric bass, bodhran and vocals, they define their music as Celtic Craic, Trad with Attitude, and Pot O' Gold Folk. While being predominantly "Celtic", they have an eclectic set of tunes that includes, Irish, Scottish, Folk, Maritime, and even a few contemporary songs. A timeless blend of music and vocal numbers that caters to all ages and all audiences.

1.30 PM VICTORIA ACCORDION CLUB BAND

The Victoria Accordion Club was started in 2002 and now has as many as 30 accordion enthusiasts attending monthly meetings and band rehearsals on the first and third Sundays of every month at the SHOAL Center in Sidney (10030 Resthaven Drive, Sidney). The VAC band is made up of 15 to 20 accordionists, ranging in levels from beginner to advanced. Due to the hard work and dedication of the group members, the group has become very popular, and performs in many local venues. The VAC band has performed at many venues and cultural events in the Victoria area, including the prestigious Christ Church Cathedral in Victoria to celebrate St. Cecilia's Day in November of each year. Due to the COVID pandemic, the club and band has not gathered formally as a group since March 2020. However, during that time, it has prepared virtual performances on YouTube for online access and enjoyment.

Caleigh is a graduate of the Royal Conservatory of Toronto in piano pedagogy and is currently pursuing graduate studies in Public and International Affairs at York University. Having sung as a choral scholar for many years in the Cathedral's Evensong service, Caleigh appreciates the opportunity to share music once again in this beautiful space.

Jennifer Turner is a classically trained soprano who has performed as a soloist with organizations throughout Victoria including Pacific Opera Victoria, Victoria Baroque, the Philharmonic Choir and the Linden Singers. In addition to performing, she teaches voice at the Victoria Conservatory of Music (VCM). Her musical training includes a M. Mus. in Vocal Performance from the University of Manitoba and a Diploma from the VCM Camosun Program where she studied with Ingrid Attrot and Nancy Argenta and was involved in the Opera Studio Program. Jennifer has been a recipient of numerous awards including an Early Music Vancouver Scholarship and an Early Career Development Grant from the BC Arts Council. She is delighted to be collaborating with Caleigh and to have the opportunity to present this program in the beautiful Cathedral.
