A bugle sounded to begin and end the day in military camps during the war. This was known as the "Last Post." It was also sounded for those who had died. We will now stand and hear the "Last Post" followed by a minute of silence, followed by the reveille.

On this day of remembrance, we remember those who paid the ultimate sacrifice, trusting that others could and would carry the torch. We think about peacekeepers and pacifists; for those who served on the front lines, for those who volunteer and for those who wait anxiously at home.

We give thanks for those who believed that the world could be a better place. As we listen, let us remember those on all sides who have died and continue to die in war.
