1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - PRAYERFUL VIGILANCE

Today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of the new liturgical year. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas. Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord in the birth of Jesus. The key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting, preparation, and justice.

Any human success requires vigilance. Opportunities and powerful moments of encounter can easily be missed when we are not attentive. It is all too easy today to live distracted and preoccupied lives. There is so much vying for our attention that it can be hard to be selective and really focus. Caught up in this whirlwind of busyness and anxiety, we become tired and almost sleepwalk through life. Advent is a time to selectively focus. These beautiful four short weeks are a time to look backward and forward and be attentive to the human journey and God's revelation. From the beginning of time, God has been seeking our attention. He constantly reminds us of the justice he desires to bring and the promise of his abiding unconditional love. CHRISTMAS ANTICIPATION PRAYER - Beginning on **November 30**, the Feast day of Saint Andrew the Apostle, the following beautiful prayer is traditionally recited fifteen (15) times a day until Christmas. This is a very meditative prayer that helps us increase our awareness of the real focus of Christmas and helps us prepare ourselves spiritually for His coming:

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, [here mention your request] through the merits of Our Saviour Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother. Amen.



DECEMBER 9THAT 7 PM JOIN SACRED HEART CATHEDRAL FOR A FESTIVAL OF LESSONS AND CAROLS. This event will be livestreamed through www.rcdk.org so you can either attend live or watch online. If you are in attendance, masks are mandatory. This joyful evening will help

us to spiritually prepare for Christmas.

On this first Sunday of Advent, the Gospel reading depicts Jesus warning His followers about the end -time. He urges them to pray, be vigilant, spiritually awake, avoid self indulgence, spiritual malaise, and a preoccupation with anxiety. Jesus advises against a lifestyle of earthly pleasures and worry. These will not matter when the Lord asks for an account of our stewardship. Stewards realize their lives are not just about the here and now. They know themselves to be reflections of God's active presence in the world and witnesses of the Lord's promises. As we begin this season of hope, let us reflect on the practical effect of having every waking moment in our lives dedicated to the Lord.

TAX RECEIPT 2021 REMINDERS. Faith in Action donations must be received by Friday, December 31 (before the banks close/or parish office closes). This includes E-transfer donations

as well. Donations may be mailed to the Chancery office post marked no later than December 31 to be eligible for 2021 tax receipt. All donations received after 12 noon on Friday, December 31, or are post marked later than December 31, will go towards the 2022 Tax Receipt.

Likewise, if you plan to attend another parish between now and the end of the year, or at Christmas, please bring your offering envelope directly to the parish office if you require your donation to be on your 2021 tax receipt. If it is not in the parish office on December 31st or postmarked December 31st it will not be included in the 2021 tax receipt year as per CRA directives. Please keep this information in mind.

Video series "Journey through Advent 2021"

Each week, beginning on Sunday, 21 November 2021, the Solemnity of Christ the King, the CCCB will release a video recording of a Bishop reflecting on the Gospel Reading for each Sunday of Advent. This year's reflections were inspired by the Indigenous



Delegation travelling to Rome to meet with Pope Francis from 17-20 December 2021.

Each reflection is based on one of the five essential stages of reconciliation: examen, confession, repentance, reparation (making amends), and reconciliation. It is likewise hoped these reflections will assist the faithful, Indigenous and non-Indigenous alike, in preparing for Pope Francis' eventual apostolic journey to Canada. The videos were developed under the auspices of the Bishops Working Group on Coordinating Indigenous Initiatives, with the script being approved by the same, as agreed to by the Executive Committee at its Special Meeting on 12 November 2021.

Rejoice!		
Community	Community is a key component of the journey to holiness. Advent provides a wonderful opportunity to take a little more time to focus on your prayer life and grow stronger in friendships on the shared journey to heaven. The ideal is to journey together as a community. You are not alone - Catholics all over the country are on the same journey. This is a time for you to speak to God and to hear and see all that he has to show you.	
Videos	To accompany the weekly handouts, there will be weekly themed videos with Fr. Mark Toups, Sr. Miriam James Heidland, and Fr. Josh Johnson. Through their witness, conversation, and prayer, you will find fresh insights into the places, people, and events of the first Advent.	
Daily Meditation	<u>Prepare</u> If you are praying with Scripture, read the passage once. Then slowly read the text a second time. Pay	
and Prayer	attention to how you feel as you read. Pay attention to which words strike you. When the text sets a sce- ne, enter the scene with Mary and Joseph or the people mentioned. Once the passage or the scene comes to its natural conclusion, continue with ARRR.	
	<u>ARRR</u> - stands for Acknowledge, Relate, Receive, and Respond. Acknowledge - You have sat with God's Word. Now, when you feel that God is saying something to you, <i>acknowledge</i> what stirs within you. Pay attention to your thoughts, feelings, and desires. These are important.	
	Relate - After you have acknowledged what is going on inside your heart, <i>relate</i> that to God. Don't just think about your thoughts, feelings, and desires. Don't just think about God or how God might react. Relate to God. Tell him how you feel, what you think and what you want. Share all your thoughts, feelings and desires with God.	
	Receive - Once you have shared everything with God, <i>receive</i> . Listen to what he is telling you. It could be a subtle voice you hear or maybe a memory pops up. Perhaps he invites you to reread the Scripture passage, or invites you into a still restful silence Trust that God is listening to you, and receive what he wants to share with you.	
	Respond - Now <i>respond</i> . Your response could be continuing your conversation with God, or resolving to do something. It could be tears or laughter. Respond with what you are receiving.	
	<u>Journal</u> Keep a record this Advent of what your prayer was like. Your journal entry does not have to be lengthy. It could be a single word or a sentence or two about what God told you or how the days' reflec- tion struck you. However you do it, journaling will help you walk closer to God this Advent.	
	<u>Commit</u> Advent can be a busy season. As you dedicate yourself to prayer this Advent, there is no better safe- guard than a good plan. Fr. Josh Johnson, one of the presenters in the <i>Rejoice!</i> videos, recommends the five Ways as a method of planning:	
	WHEN will I spend time with Jesus?	
	WHERE will I spend time with Jesus?	
	WHAT are Jesus and I going to do together?	
	WHO will hold me accountable for my time with Jesus?	
	WHY am I prioritizing my time with Jesus?	
	Making a commitment is the first step in transforming your prayer life. These weeks with <i>Rejoice! Finding Your Place in the Advent Story</i> is the perfect time to begin.	

Daily Meditation and Prayer	Week One - November 27 - December 3, 2021 <i>Rejoice!</i> Finding Your Place in the Advent Story - <i>Fr. Mark Toups</i> <i>The First Week of Advent: PLACES</i>
<i>Introduction</i> Psalm 85:11-12	<i>Where We Are</i> influences who we are, how we think, feel, and act. It shapes our values and priorities and is the lens through which we see the world. The places that Mary and Joseph knew also reveal much about God. If we truly want to come to appreciate what God is doing in the Advent story, then we must come to appreciate what God is revealing about himself in the places of ancient Israel.
	The places that shaped the very first Advent did so by influencing Mary and Joseph. Some of these places, such as Nazareth and Bethlehem, are explicitly mentioned in the Scriptures. Some of them, such as the Temple in Jerusalem and Herod's palace, are appreciated within a broader understanding of Israel's history.
	Welcome to the first week of Advent.
	Read each of the daily passages a few times. Consider how often Mary and Joseph would have prayed with the very same words you are reading.
Saturday Nov 27 Psalm 25:22	Israel - Read Psalm 25. What is God saying to you in the Bible passage? How does it apply to your life? What do you want to say to God? What are you searching for?
	Prayer - "Father, I beg you to make this Advent my best ever. Help me to find you deep with- in. Reveal to me what it is I am really searching for."
Sunday Nov 28 Psalm 21:2	Temple - Read Psalm 21. What do you <i>really</i> want from God? Allow yourself to ask this question in earnest, and open yourself to the answer.
	Prayer - "Father, help me to be present to the present moment. Reveal to me what you want for me and what my deepest desires are."
Monday Nov 29 Psalm 19:12-13	Galilee - Read 1 Kings 19:9-12. What is God saying to you in the Bible passage? How does it apply to your life? What do you want to say to God? Are you comfortable with the ordinary?
	Prayer - "Father, help me to be present to the present moment. Help me to find you in the ordi- nary of life."
Tuesday Nov 30 Psalm 131:2	Nazareth - Read Psalm 131. What is God saying to you in the Bible passage? How does it apply to your life? What do you want to say to God? Are you comfortable with quiet?
	Prayer - "Father, help me to slow down, both externally and internally. Help me to quiet myself on both the outside and the inside."
Wednesday Dec 1 Jeremiah 29:11	Judea - Read - Jeremiah 29:11-14. What is God saying to you in the Bible passage? How does it apply to your life? What do you want to say to God? What is his promise saying to you?
	Prayer - "Father, help me to be not afraid of silence. Help me to find you with me, deep within, in the silence."
Thursday Dec 2 Isaiah 55:11	Palace - Read Isaiah 55:10-13. Specifically, what is God saying to you about his promises?
	Prayer - "Father, reveal to me how I may have been affected by unmet expectations or unful- filled promises. Reveal to me how this has affected our relationship."
Friday Dec 3 Psalm 37:4	Bethlehem - Read Psalm 37:1-7. Look back at the first week of Advent. What were the themes? What did God say? As the First Week concludes, ask again, what do you really want from God?
	Prayer - "Father, help me to trust you. Help me to follow you. Give me the grace I need to fol- low you wherever you desire to lead me this Advent."
