Seating will also now be blocked off to ensure social distancing between households. Attendees are asked to either visit from their designated seat or outside after the service. Those uncomfortable attending in -person are still invited to join Okotoks United Church's 10:45AM worship service through Zoom.

Zoom services will also continue to be an option for those who would prefer to wait a little longer.

We encourage everyone to get their vaccinations if possible.

Please do not attend if you any Covid like symptoms.
