Celebrating the Reign of Christ Sunday

The Reign of Christ is the last Sunday in the church year. It marks the end of Ordinary Time and serves as a prologue to the festivities of Advent. We celebrate Christ's role as Lord of all—the world, the church, and our lives. We celebrate that God's reign in the entire universe has already been accomplished, while at the same time, anticipate the day when Christ will return. Thus, we remind ourselves of the already/not-yet tension of God's reign over all creation. We pray, as Jesus taught us, "thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven" (Matthew 6:10). We await Christ's second coming when he will reign upon the earth for one thousand years before the final day of judgement, and there will be a new heaven and a new earth. (Revelation 20-21)
