Cariboo Hill Temple Band

The Salvation Army's Cariboo Hill Temple Band has a long-standing tradition of providing musical excellence, inspiration, and ministry. They put on several concerts throughout the year at the Salvation Army, also at many other churches throughout the lower mainland. Their present home is in Burnaby at Hwy & Cariboo Road, where they provide weekly musical support to the Sunday morning church services. But they have had many homes...

The band was officially formed in Vancouver and was originally called the Vancouver No. 1 Corp Band. The band was present when the first CPR passenger train arrived on the shores of Burrard Inlet, and also at the opening of Stanley Park, and the opening of the first Hotel Vancouver. Over the years, there were moves and building upgrades, and the band changed its name to the Vancouver Citadel Band, the Vancouver Temple Band, and now the Cariboo Hill Temple Band.

All the members of the band are members of the church. They come from all walks of life, including students, professional musicians, Salvation Army employees and clergy, both retired and active. The youngest member Is 14, and one of the senior members has been playing with the band continuously since 1952! For today's Christmas Eve Service, we are joined by members of the Salvation Army's *Jubilee Brass Band*.

The Cariboo Hill Temple Band is conducted by David Mills, the 20th music director the band has had. He has been a composer and school music teacher for over 20 years and is presently the director of bands at R.E. Mountain Secondary School in Langley.
