Parish Events

WE GIVE THANKS FOR THE ABILITY TO HAVE IN-PERSON SUNDAY SERVICES! Everyone is asked to register for our Sunday Services, through the website or calling the parish office by Friday noon. Mask-wearing is mandatory. Everyone is also asked to please maintain social distancing from those not in our family unit. If you're over the age of 12, and aren't fully vaccinated, please stay home, because of your increased risk of contracting and spreading the delta variant of the virus. If you have cold-like or flu-like symptoms, please also stay home. The Services are continuing to be live-streamed.

Services are posted live at 9:30 am on Sundays on our main Facebook page. A Facebook account isn't needed to watch. You just go to the link <https://www.facebook.com/stpaulscalgary> and click on the video. At around 11:30 am onward, if you don't have a Facebook account, you'll be able to watch the Service by going to our website (<https://www.stpaulscalgary.ca/podcasts/media>) or YouTube Channel.

The Parish Office will be closed from Dec. 24 to Jan. 2. The Office answering machine gives instructions on how to contact Fergus in an emergency.

Sunday School Resources for Sunday School at home from the National Church are posted weekly on our website. To access them, please type "Sunday School" in the search box, and click on "Sunday School". **Because it has so much interaction among the children, we're holding off on in-person Sunday School at the moment, but plan to resume it as soon as it's safe to do so.**

Outreach

PWRDF supports Displaced Families in Iraq

In the Iraqi city of Sinjar, displaced families returning to their homes are already faced with public health risks associated with disease outbreaks. The situation is worsened by COVID-19.

PWRDF is contributing \$30,000 to a Lutheran World Federation Iraq project that is providing hygiene equipment, improving access to clean water and raising awareness about COVID-19 prevention. The total budget is approximately \$80,000 and the project will continue through December.

Inreach: With many in our Parish congregation going through financial struggles at present due to the economy, a special fund has been set-up.
