
The Church of St. John the DivineThe 2nd Sunday after ChristmasJanuary 2, 2022

The Proclamation of the Word

Let us listen for the Word of God in Holy Scripture.

The First Reading

For thus says the LORD: Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, 'Save, O LORD, your people, the remnant of Israel.' See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labour, together; a great company, they shall return here. With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back. I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel. and Ephraim is my firstborn. Hear the word of the LORD, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; say, 'He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock.' For the LORD has ransomed Jacob. and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him.

The Epistle

Ephesians 1:3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

The Gospel Before the Gospel

John 1:1-18

Cantor: Alleluia. All: Alleluia.

Cantor: Glory to Christ who is preached among the nations, and believed on in the world. Timothy 3:16

Hear the Good news of Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All: Glory to you, O Christ.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me."') From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.



We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of your reign.

Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice. Hear us, most merciful God, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your reign.

Help us, who are baptized into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Mary, the apostles, and prophets, and of all peoples, living and departed.



Readings for January 9th – The Baptism of the Lord

Isaiah 43:1-7 The prophet affirms that Israel is "precious in [God's] sight." An astonishing claim that the creator of the cosmos loves not generically but loves a particular people whom God knows by name.

Psalm 29 A mighty Psalm which finds God's majestic presence shot through all of nature's grandeur. Classical theologians remind us that the faithful ought to read not just one book but two, the book of scripture *and* the book of nature. In this Psalm, the book of scripture teaches us how to read the book of nature.

Acts 8:14-17 The vitality and bravery of the early Jesus community came not just from vivid memory of Jesus's life, death, and resurrection but also the dramatic and vitalizing power of the Holy Spirit.

Luke 3:15-17, 21-22 John sounds a frightening note when he promises that the Messiah to come will gather up the wheat but "burn [the chaff] with unquenchable fire." But what if both the wheat and the chaff are in us? Perhaps we ought not to fear a purifying fire that removes all that is in us that bears no fruit.
