Moving to Windsor, Ontario, in 1968, he became Organist and Choirmaster at All Saints' Anglican Church there, and in 1970, began his 40-year tenure as a Professor in the School of Music at the University of Windsor. David and his wife, Lonnie, are excited to be back in Victoria, enjoying time with family and looking forward to renewing old friendships and making new ones.

This hour long service in the church will feature lots of jazz along with contemporary prayers, poems, and readings. Come and see and hear what it's all about!


