Dear Friends in Christ,

October brings much meaning for us. The weather is starting to cool down, our friends from the north will be returning, Halloween is just around the corner, but most of all we remember Martin Luther and God working through him to reform the church and our lives in Christ. Let's take a look into the life of Luther.

Martin Luther was born on November 10, 1483, in Eisleben, Germany.

His name was just a breath on the lips of loved ones for his first decades of life. Following the Church tradition, Martin was baptized a Catholic the day after his birth, on November 11, the feast day of St. Martin of Tours. But that was about to change.

He lived from 1483 to 1546, in the full scope of history merely a speck in time ...

... but few have changed the world - reformed the world - like Martin Luther did in his 62 years.

While Martin was still an infant, the family moved to Mansfield. Determined to give Martin the best education, his parents sent him to schools in Mansfield, Magdeburg, and finally Eisenach to prepare Martin for university and a career as a lawyer. In 1501, he continued pursuit of his career at the University of Erfurt, from which he received his Master of Arts in philosophy in 1505.

JULY 2, 1505

Returning to Erfurt after visiting his family, Luther was caught in a severe storm, with violent thunder and lightning. In the midst of the storm, after having been knocked to the ground by a particularly violent strike of lightning, Martin prayed to St. Anne and vowed: "Help me! And I will become a monk!"

And on July 17, Luther entered the Black Monastery in Erfurt, much to the disappointment of his father. After entering the monastery, Luther pursued his religious life with vigor, studying Scripture and struggling with God as his faith developed. Twelve years later came the fateful day when he nailed the Ninety-Five Theses to the Castle Church Door in Wittenburg on October 31, 1517.

1522: Luther translates the New Testament into German.

1524: Achtliederbuch (A Book of Eight Hymns), the first Lutheran hymnal

1527: Luther writes "A Mighty Fortress"^[1]_[SEP]

1529: Luther publishes the Large Catechism, and the Small Catechism.

1534: The First complete edition of Luther's Bible commentaries is published.

1538: Luther's Smalcald Articles are published.

1539: The first volume of Luther's collected works is compiled

TRUST IN JESUS CHRIST ALONE...Luther said that one need only to place trust in Jesus Christ alone and His good work on the cross.

Comfort is located squarely in Jesus Christ, nowhere else.


For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast.

These inspired words of God finally can be fully grasped as God intended.



We have decided this year instead of doing two food basket donations, we will just do one. We are again giving the food baskets to Buckingham Exceptional School which is just down the road from us. The principal said that she had about 60 families that could use our help this year. She asked if we could give both turkeys and hams so that we would give 30 of each. We

would like to make this a huge project with 60 sacks of nonperishable food to go along with the turkeys and hams. We will be taking the food to the school the week of December 6. That gives us about 2 months to gather the nonperishable food. When you are at the store and they have a bogo, buy one for yourself and bring the free one in as a donation. If you find something on sale, buy several extras to bring in. Remember, we are trying to fill 60 bags with food. If you buy 60 cans of corn, that will just put one can in each bag. We are going to use Thrivent money to help pay for the meats, but we could also use additional donations to help with that cost. Bins will be put in the narthex and the fellowship entry for your donations. Let's support this project and see if we can make this a great blessing to many families. Thanks for your help.
