



LIRS Hope for the Holidays


The Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS), a part of our national church since 1939, reports that as of Sept. 13, 2021, more than 23,000 family members were being held in U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) detention facilities, awaiting resolution of their immigration status. More than 77 percent of those detained have no criminal record, according to the LIRS. (Women and girls continue to be one of the most vulnerable demographics in the U.S. immigration system, reports the LIRS.) Since 2014, family detention has increased 4000 percent! And there are only 2,000 beds in detention centers for mothers and children seeking safety in America.


