THE CONTEXT

The book of Ephesians divides logically into two sections.

Chapters 1 to 3 emphasize doctrine, beliefs, concepts, orthodoxy

Chapters 4 to 6 emphasize duty, behavior, conduct, orthopraxy

The link between the sections is established by the word "therefore" or "then" in verse 1 of chapter 4.

A. METICULOUS MAINTENANCE – (v.3)

³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

"Be diligent to preserve..." "Do your best to maintain."

- 8. In what contexts do you spend time, energy, and money on maintenance?
- 9. What kinds of effort are required to maintain unity in a friendship, marriage, staff, or church?
- 10. What effort could you/believers exert to strengthen unity at WEFC right now?

B. A WORTHY WALK - (v.1-2)

¹ Therefore I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received.

"walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you were called.".

- 11. What does a police officer or politician or teacher do (or not do) to "walk worthy of his/her calling?"
- 12. How would you describe a Christian's "calling?"
- 13. Consider the four virtues that are worthy of the Christian calling.

Humility, Gentleness, Patience, Forebearance

- a. Can you give an example for each of these virtues in which the virtue was displayed in a way that preserved or enhanced unity?
- b. Can you think of an example in which the opposites (pride, harshness, impatience, hard-heartedness) fostered disunity?

C. A FIRM FOUNDATION - (v.4-6)

"There is <u>ONE</u> body and <u>ONE</u> Spirit, just as you were called in <u>ONE</u> hope of your calling, <u>ONE</u> Lord, <u>ONE</u> faith, <u>ONE</u> baptism, <u>ONE</u> God and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all."

Paul lists seven spiritual foundational truths/realities which must be respected in order to maintain unity.

One BODY – the universal church

One SPIRIT – the Holy Spirit

One HOPE – of your calling

One LORD – Jesus Christ

One FAITH – once delivered to the saints (Jude 3)

One BAPTISM – baptism of the Spirit

One GOD and FATHER of all – Our Father in heaven...
