Happy New Year! In the spirit of hope and gratitude, I want to say THANK YOU to each and every one of you for the care you are showing each other in this latest COVID surge. Thank you for wearing masks without complaint. Thank you for getting vaccinated. Thank you for staying home if you are experiencing symptoms or are at high risk. Thanks to your diligence we have been able to continue worshipping together in-person safely and without spreading the virus further.

It is our profound hope to continue to offer options for both in-person and online worship in the coming weeks, including regular Sunday worship. To prioritize the safe continuation of worship and reduce exposure risks, we are moving other meetings and gatherings online wherever possible. The office will remain locked, we remind you to continue to wear a mask when it is necessary to enter. Please keep your visits to the office brief.

Effective immediately: readers are no longer permitted to remove their masks to speak. Masks must be worn inside the church building at all times. Please make sure that your mask covers both your mouth and your nose.

WHERE THE MAP BEGINS A Blessing for Epiphany
