Genesis 1:1(ESV)

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth.

John 1:1-3, 12-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made.

INTRODUCTION:

What story makes the best sense of the universe in which we find ourselves?

1. The universe had a beginning (which means it is not eternal)

"In the <u>beginning</u>, God created the heavens and the earth." Genesis 1:1

"For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth." Isaiah 65:17

"Almost everyone now believes that the universe, and time itself, had a beginning." —Stephen Hawking

2. **The universe was created by God** (which means God pre-existed the universe)

"Why is there something rather than nothing?" —Gottfried Wilhelm Leibniz (1646-1716)

"Because there is a law such as gravity, the universe can and will create itself from nothing. Spontaneous creation is the reason there is something rather than nothing, why the universe exists, why we exist. . . . It is not necessary to invoke God." —Stephen Hawking

"In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." Genesis 1:1

"Some would claim the answer to these questions is that there is a God who chose to create the universe that way. It is reasonable to ask who or what created the universe, but if the answer is God, then the question has merely been deflected to that of who created God." —Stephen Hawking

3. **The universe was created with purpose** (which explains why we all live as if our lives truly have meaning)

What story makes the best sense of the fact that we all live as if our lives truly have meaning and purpose?

The pessimistic secular story: life has no ultimate meaning or purpose, and we must face this harsh reality.

The optimistic secular story: life has no ultimate meaning, but we can create our own meaning.
