Important Registration Notes

Registration is online via <u>southwoodchurch.ca/circles</u>. For Confirmation, Baptism, and Reaffirmation of Faith candidates, the deadline to register is February 3, 2022. For those transferring their membership from another congregation or church, the deadline to register is March 17, 2022. This Learning Circle is open to all those ages 13 and up. Special Notes

Confirmands and candidates for Baptism need to attend all 6 sessions. Those transferring are welcome to attend all 6 but are only required to attend the last 2 (if they are transferring from another congregation of The United Church of Canada) or the last 3 (if they are transferring from outside The United Church of Canada). Prospective transferees who are unable to obtain a certificate or letter of good standing from their previous congregation or church must attend all 6 sessions and will be considered candidates for Reaffirmation of Faith (please contact Rev. Sam for more details if this is your situation).

Learning Circle Description

Were you baptized as an infant or child and now feel like you're ready to make your faith your own? Is it time to make a public profession of your faith? In our tradition, **Confirmation** is the rite through which those baptized as infants or children are admitted into full Church membership. Similarly, do you consider yourself a Christian, but have not yet been baptized? Are you ready to make that commitment before God and your fellow believers? **Believer's Baptism** is a sacrament administered to teens or adults who have not previously been baptized. Through it, they're also admitted into full Church membership. Or, alternatively, did you at one time become a full member of another congregation or church and now feel like Southwood is your spiritual home? **Transfer of Membership** is how we receive and affirm our covenant relationship together as Christians in a local context.

If you're 13+ and answered "yes" to any of the questions above, this Learning Circle is for you! You're invited to officially "join the church" through one of these rites of passage. Together, we'll explore our heritage of faith, share our personal stories of what it means to us to follow Jesus, and learn about the privileges and responsibilities involved in becoming a member of Christ's Church in a local congregation.

Learning Objectives

Upon successful completion of this Learning Circle, participants will:

- 1. Become eligible as candidates for Confirmation, Baptism, Reaffirmation of Christian Faith, or transfer of membership;
- 2. Be able to articulate the basic beliefs and practices of the Christian faith;
- 3. Be able to describe their personal faith journeys and to express what it means to them to be followers of Jesus Christ;
- 4. Have a greater familiarity with The United Church of Canada, its history, theology, and mission, and its place within the larger Christian Church;
- 5. Understand the roles, responsibilities, and privileges of full members of Southwood United Church;
- 6. Upon approval by the Church Council, be invited to participate in a celebration service where they will be confirmed, baptized, and/or received as full members of the Church.

Homework & Assignments

1. Journal Entries (Confirmation, Baptism, & Reaffirmation candidates only)

Participants are asked to write a short "journal entry" (200–500 words or so) following each of the learning sessions, in which they reflect upon their own learning and faith formation from the material and discussion. Potential prompting questions could be (but are certainly not limited to): What did I learn? How is God speaking to me? What stuck out the most? With what did I agree/disagree? What do I want to know more about?

During sessions, participants will be invited (but not required) to share highlights or wrestlings from their journal entries with the group.

2. Reading Mark's Gospel (Confirmation, Baptism, & Reaffirmation candidates only)

Participants are asked to read through the Gospel of Mark over the course of the Learning Circle as a personal and communal spiritual practice. This will mean reading approximately 10 verses a day, or a chapter-and-a-half a week.

A reading schedule / guide will be provided following the first session

3. Transfer Certificates (*Transferees only*)

Transferees need to submit a Certificate of Transfer or Letter of Good Standing from their previous congregation or church. Rev. Sam can assist you in obtaining this document, if necessary (please reach out via email).

Please email a copy of your certificate/letter to Sam or drop it off inperson at the church office no later than March 30, 2022.

4. Profession of Faith (All participants)

Prior to the final session, all participants are asked to create personal professions of the stories of their Christian faith. These could take a variety of forms: written statements/stories, visual art pieces, poems, videos ... or other creative mediums! We'll celebrate whatever format/medium feels right to you.

The profession of faith should seek to answer the following questions: What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus Christ? Who is Jesus to me?

During Session 6, participants will be asked to share/present/explain their profession of faith with the group. Aim for 5 minutes. Candidates for Confirmation, Baptism, and Reaffirmation of Faith will also be invited to share their professions of faith with the congregation (details will be discussed).

Please come ready to share your profession of faith on April 10, 2022

Evaluation

Candidates for Confirmation, Baptism, or Reaffirmation of Faith will be (graciously) evaluated by the Lead Pastor as to the genuineness of their faith in Christ and their readiness to become full members of the Church. This is not a formal evaluation, but a relational one. In order for candidates to be confirmed/baptized/reaffirmed, the Lead Pastor must be satisfied, upon their completion of the Learning Circle, of their ability and desire to make the relevant vows in good faith.

"In order to become a full member, a person must have enough knowledge about the Christian faith and the United Church to make their commitment with understanding" (*The Manual* (2022), §B.3.3.2).

Evaluation of those seeking to transfer their membership to Southwood United Church is based simply upon their submission of a Certificate of Transfer or Letter of Good Standing and their participation in the required sessions.

Important Policies

It is the responsibility of the Church Council to approve people as full members of the congregation (see *The Manual*, §B.3.3.1). Prior to the scheduled celebration service, the Lead Pastor will make recommendations to the Council regarding each candidate and request motions of approval to move forward.

Learning Circle Outline

Each session will begin with a welcome, check-in, and invitation to share, and will conclude with space for discussion, questions, ponderings, and prayer. All the readings mentioned below are listed in the Bibliography and will be made available directly to participants via email and/or a shared Google Drive folder.
