

Celebrant Gracious God, with this bread and wine we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, and we offer ourselves to you in him.


Send your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts, that we may know the presence of Jesus in the breaking of bread, and share in the life of the family of your children.

RIVENDELL RETREAT
(if at first you don't succeed try try again)

Well- The rector and his warden have decided that we are going to assume that in 5 weeks time, a good number of us can "go on retreat" together. SO HERE WE GO. Third try. There is already 6 of us "signed up".

Rivendell is open now. It is large, spacious, wheel chair accessible, aerated and all guests have their own ensuite rooms. Check the web page www.rivendellretreat.org

Getting there - we are hoping to have at least 4 cars pooling us all (4 willing drivers of course, with 3 or 4 passengers each). Departure 10 a.m. on Monday 7th, Arrival home 3 p.m. Thursday the 10th.

Marks and Margaret will lead the retreat- which will include seeing beautiful parts of Bowen Island- the theme for the retreat will be developed with input from those who sign up.

Food- bring your own breakfast and snacks, two ladies are making soups for lunch, and (at the moment) we are imagining two catered suppers (caterers on Bowen are superb)

Costs minimal- 25% of car costs on ferries, (those over 65 don't pay for themselves), costs of catered dinners, and for one's room one pays simply what one can afford. For those stretched with costs the rector has agreed that the church will supplement. Pay what you can.
