Council Highlights - February

Brett L led devotions from the New City Catechism on the Lord's Prayer as a model to address our Father as King of the universe, corporate protector and guide. Following devotions we passed the prayer bowl and prayed for our church family.

We processed the membership transfer of <u>Jason and Niki U and their boys Brody and Wesley</u>. We also discussed the importance of welcoming newcomers to our services and considered strategies to improve in this area.

We were blessed to meet with the Healthy Church Task Force on January 20th, spending time reviewing the roles and responsibilities of Council, elders, deacons, Council Executive, and pastor. We plan to continue this training in late March, reviewing the governance processes, interactions between roles, and hospitality.

We gave guidance to our Classis delegates concerning how to represent our council regarding the Human Sexuality Report. Classis has a special meeting to discuss the report on February 5. Council reiterated its support of the report but recognizes that aspects of the report have the potential to bring division to the denomination and our church family. We pray for wisdom for all the Classis representatives and the denomination. We would like to continue exploring some of the issues raised in the report with the congregation. Our first step will be a meeting to provide information and perspective related to issues surrounding homosexuality. We created a subcommittee to determine an effective approach. We also discussed the need to engage and listen to families in our church for whom this issue is deeply personal.

This month begins a new meeting schedule for our council. In two weeks (Feb 15), the elders and deacons will have separate meetings. The consistory meeting (elders) will include time for pastoral care, prayer, and ministry reports. The deacons will continue with their monthly meeting to discuss the diaconate ministry and those people in need of support. The next full Council meeting will be March 1.
