
### And a Little Child Shall Read Them

### NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S UNITED CHURCH Written by P. Marie Wedderburn



Sunday, January 23<sup>rd</sup> saw fourteen people gather with Matthew once again. Using the scripture John 14:25-27 and reading the children's book *The Remember Balloons* written by Jessie Oliveros, Matthew spoke of what happens when we do not remember our own and our collective faith stories. For us in the community of faith, the Holy Spirit gently helps us in our memories of who we are in God. For just as the Israelites did not always remember and through prophets

and poets they remembered that they were beloved by God. *The Remember Balloons* spoke of dementia and as we gently tell the stories that we have shared with those who have Alzheimer's how these stories form a bond between us. So what are the stories that we need to keep sharing from our personal and collective lives so that they are not forgotten?

And then on January 30<sup>th</sup>, fourteen people joined Julia for the first time in 2022 at St. Andrew's as she spoke from the scripture passage Genesis 1:27 and the children's book *Be Who You Are* written by Todd Parr. She said that we are created in God's image and so to be who we are for we were made by God to show reflections of God. For imagine that God is the sun and we are prisms that radiate God's light into the world. However, sometimes our prism becomes cloudy and so we do not reflect God's light and it can become difficult to be who we truly are – AMAZING – for God knows that each one of us is unique just like everyone else is and to let our light reflect this not only to ourselves but to others also. So let us remember that each one of us is amazing as we be who we are!

### Mission Possible Update:

Travel restrictions with Covid-19 again prohibited our mission possible team from travelling to the Dominican Republic in 2021. However, we continued to support the TEARS charity through donations to the church, school and programs in the community. One special project that OUC funded in 2021 was the installation of the lights for the community soccer field on the TEARS complex. In previous years we fundraised to help bring in 100's of truck load of soil for the field and the planting of the grass to create this soccer field. Previous to the development of the field the youth had to practice in a smaller area in the community baseball field.

During several trips to the DR the principle soccer coach (Obed Penuela) often told me of his dream for a lighted soccer facility. With the DR close to the equator, the sun sets around 6pm in the winter months and also sets around 7pm in the summer months. Many of the senior youth involved in the soccer program work during the day and are unable to practice during the weekdays due to darkness. The installed lights now allow the soccer program to have practices and games in the evenings. TEARS has the only soccer facility in the surrounding area with lighting allowing not only the expansion of their program but the entire city of La Vega.

We have just confirmed a small team will be travelling to the Dominican Republic in July 2022 to host a summer baseball camp for the children of the barrio. During the past 18 month the mission possible team has been fundraising and collecting baseball equipment (gloves, shoes, bats, balls, bases, etc.). Please watch for future fundraising announcements as we will be looking to provide on-going support for the community baseball program.
