

Good Works

Notes from Keith, the Exec. Director

Christ Lutheran has supported Good Works for many years. Like all of us, Good Works continues to be challenged by the COVID-19 Pandemic, but they are still serving people who are poor and homeless. Some Good Works programs have been scaled back for the pandemic, but Timothy House is still housing people who homeless, Friday Night Life still offers a weekly meal, and the Transformation Station still offers cars and appliances for those who put in service time.

Building Sign of HOPE was slowed by the pandemic restricting work groups and increased materials costs, but the building is weather tight and will likely be completed by the end of this year. This building will serve folks who cannot stay at Timothy House. It will offer individual rooms with bathrooms and a common living and kitchen space. This project was partially funded by our church's Impact Giving Grant.

Workshop on Regeneration • Coming soon!

The Earth Justice Committee is planning a series of workshops for members of the congregation and guests from the community guided by materials and models from Paul Hawken's book *Regeneration: Ending the climate crisis in one generation.* This book was reviewed in the January *Chi Rho.* The focus will be learning about effective ways of caring for the earth and then acting on them. First we will review tools from the Active Hope Retreat sessions back in 2020, for example, how to reframe the despair one can feel when confronted with the enormity of the climate crisis. Then we will discuss the actions which some of us have initiated since then as well as consider emerging insights in the field to build upon and expand on our previous work. We welcome new participants and will offer innovative sources of knowledge and models for inspiration. You can find a copy of the book, *Regeneration*, on the Earth Justice bookshelf in the narthex. We will be doing a bulk order for the book (will save you \$5 plus tax) once we have established set dates for the series.

Montaña de Luz News

Montaña de Luz continues keeping pace with developments in Honduras. Children who lived at the orphanage before are now living on their own or in foster homes, and MdL is expanding into services for families affected by HIV/AIDS. They offer these additional services through the Healthy Families Honduras program: HIV testing and follow-up services, family and individual counseling, private and group tutoring with university prep, childcare, and emergency housing. The facilities on the mountain are being repurposed to be a resource for the surrounding community, including HIV testing and offering week-long family trainings once a month on top-



ics such as computer literacy and employment support, budgeting, entrepreneurship, small business loans, and prenatal/childcare. The mountain is also hosting support groups for women.

If COVID-19 subsides and it is safe, service trips to MdL will again be offered later this year, with more information to come. Also, the annual Fiesta fundraising dinner and auction is scheduled for Friday, April 8th this year.
