

#### **TOP 10 LIST**

- 1. In January to March 2021, we successfully launched an online presence for CADRE.
- 2. We hosted Westview Prayer Meetings (online & in person) every month for much of 2021.
- 3. We were thrilled to launch a brand-new community group during a pandemic. Thank you to Grace & Ian Whitehead for sensing the Lord's leading in your life to step out in faith to do this.
- 4. We developed a deeper understanding of what it means to be the church, the body of Christ, and how we all have a part to play in the work Jesus is inviting us into.
- 5. We hosted our Better Together Marriage Event (via Zoom) with couples from across the city of Calgary, in February 2021. This was in partnership with a number of area churches.
- 6. I (Tyler) had the privilege of preaching for 5 weeks our *NEXT: Leadership Through Liminal Space* sermon series as we prepared to welcome our new pastoral staff.
- 7. We trusted the LORD and experienced his goodness and faithfulness through a year of much uncertainty and challenge.
- 8. We ran a 3-week Evangelism course called "Life Shared" with plans to continue offering this going forward.
- 9. We were able to resume CADRE in-person this fall of 2021 and offered two classes taught by Bill Christieson, Glen Worobets and myself.
- 10. In December we baptized 3 individuals our first baptisms since the beginning of Covid!

## Worship & Outreach Pastor | Rhys Green

Certainly 2021 was the year with the most changes since I joined the staff in 2010! Here are my highlights of the past year of ministry at Westview, in no particular order:

#### **TOP 7 LIST**

- 1. We began the year by becoming a satellite distribution centre for the Calgary Food Bank. We quickly assembled a team of 20 to assemble and distribute hampers for those in the northwest to pick up here, once a week. In the last year we have had more than 30 different people on the team and have assembled and distributed over 600 large hampers of food. We have a tremendous team!
- 2. We hosted our first Missions conference, by ZOOM, in January. With help from CBM, we had over 100 people attend online to hear ministry updates from those pastors that we support in Rwanda, Bolivia, and Lebanon. We give thanks for our dedicated Ministry Beyond Ourselves team, and we will miss the passion and expertise of Gordon King and Bill Christieson as they move on in 2022.
- 3. I am deeply grateful to our musicians, singers, and techs, who provided a full and complete worship music experience every single Sunday morning, online-only, or combined with some of our Westview family in attendance, every week since Covid altered our lives. Their commitment, generosity and dependability have been a blessing to all of us a constant in 2 years of uncertainty. A special thanks to Sarah Wipf for her selfless service in so many areas of Worship, and throughout our church.
- 4. We shifted from pre-recorded Sunday services to a hybrid of livestream and in-person worship services in June. Through trial-and-error and new technology, we have grown our technical team from 3 to 9, and my deepest thanks goes to Kevin Barrett for his tireless work, every week, in training our team. Our online views are now double the number that we had just a few months ago, and we see new visitors many weeks that have discovered us online!
- 5. Our Brown Bags 4 Calgary Kids ministry had a very productive year. Under the leadership of Daniel Sawyer, we made nearly 150 lunches each of the weeks that the 6 schools in our area were in person! The BB4K team was a committed mix of our Westview family and community volunteers.
- 6. The Westview Community Garden had a real "bounce-back" year. After an uncertain first year of Covid in 2020, we rented out nearly every garden box in 2021. Thanks to the Westview families who did maintenance and upkeep of the garden . . . you have blessed those in Ranchlands who really appreciate the garden that we share.

7. And finally, the arrival of Pastor Garry has, for me, brought new ideas, vitality, and the challenge again to listen and respond to how God leads us. His passion for Worship is contagious and his leadership is inspiring.

Most of my time is spent with youth in mind and so engaging with older minds and more complex questions is always a treat. Not to mention, on average, that it is rare to find young adults in church. So, although it may not be as 'flashy' as a wild youth night, it is encouraging to simply see our young adults and walk alongside them.
- 2. Youth Fire Nights This was at the beginning of my time here at Westview. I hadn't fully met all the youth, but I knew that fires have an inherent quality of drawing people together and teens love watching things burn. When I announced that there would be a fire night, there was vocal



- approval and legitimate screams of excitement over "fire." The actual event was just as fun as anticipated and we cooked s'mores and hot dogs.
- 3. Surprise Discussion One of the best moments in Youth ministry is when you're hit by a deep, sincere question that you didn't see coming. This happened one youth night while we were having small groups and I was asked about how I felt about marriage. I was surprised because the question came from a group consisting of only the guys. After my surprise wore off, I was delighted at their question and asked, "How many of you actually want to be married in the future?" Each student raised their hand confidently. This began a wonderful surprise discussion.

The best is yet to come ... It is a privilege to have so many memorable moments behind me within the few months I've been at Westview. They give me optimism at the events that are still down the line. Winter Retreat 2022 at Gull Lake has just taken place. The biggest one, coming this summer, is SERVE 2022 in Nelson, BC. There is also the 403 Conference in May that we are lucky was rescheduled. There are summer camps, outings, more fire nights and, my favourite - discussions and growth that engage life and God.

## Children's & Family Pastor | Hanneke Boersema

- 2. Various repairs were made to the church to maintain operations, particularly as they applied to the heating system.
- 3. Many thanks to all those who volunteer their time to assist with building projects throughout the year. Darren Drake joined the building team this year and has completed several tasks that keep the building operating.
- 4. The staff offices were painted this year with the assistance of Kari Smith, Darren Drake and Tony Gellion. Many thanks.
- Steve Sawatsky continues to provide faithful leadership as Head Teller and the many associated financial duties. Steve is also very dedicated to keeping the grounds looking professional.

- 6. Thank you to Glenn and Lola Swanson for their annual care of our flower beds that add color to the front of the church.
- 7. Thank you to David Mitchell who was the Liaison to the other churches until he moved to Sherwood Park in the spring of 2021. This role is now being looked after by Fernando Arteaga.
- 8. The 2021 deficit was absorbed this year by the Westview cash flow; however, this is not sustainable for future years. Expenses exceeded giving by approximately \$30,000. Expenditure was kept as low as possible while maintaining the various ministries and the building.

Current events aside, 2021 was quite likely a candidate for the top 10 most challenging years for the HR Committee at Westview.

#### **TOP 7 LIST**

- 1. The retirement of our senior and children's pastors, both of whom made Westview their home and served the church for over 20 years. Finding candidates to fill their shoes was not going to be an easy task.
- 2. Search committees had been hard at work from the previous year and God blessed us with two ideal candidates. Both committees managed to facilitate the process for both candidates with some creativity due to the issues brought about by the pandemic.
- 3. After the candidates were found, Grace Neustaedter decided to step down from the HR Chair role, after serving through several challenging years, and I (Kevin Barrett) stepped into the role.
- 4. As part of her final duties, Grace oversaw a wonderful send off for Dayle and Dawn.
- 5. During the transition of a senior pastor leaving, a new senior pastor coming online, incoming and departing HR Chairs, year end performance reviews were conducted over Zoom. Zoom has seemingly become an integral part of church HR Committee business and has provided some advantages to dealing with some HR needs by making it easy to facilitate meetings on short notice.
- 6. Shortly into my tenure, Tash Ingram, Youth & Young Adults Pastor shared some wonderful news, she would be expecting a baby in October. This brought about some planning for the maternity leave to commence in early October, but God had other plans. Tash, having to take time off early, hastened the need to find a replacement. After some searching and interviewing candidates, God in His providence, guided us to Emmanuel (Ejay) Vedoya.
- 7. We did end up coming in under budget for the payroll and staff costs for 2021. There are of course lots of possible explanations, in writing this, I can only consider one, GOD IS GOOD!

## **Crossover Japanese Church of Calgary Fellowship**

First of all, thank you for your prayers and generous support for CJCC.

Over the past 6 months, we had entered a new season of leadership as a church and God has been/is surely good to us and has been contributing greatly to this particular time of transition. Although, some of our ministries are still taking place via Zoom, it is such a great encouragement to see the huge spiritual thirst among the congregation which is continually increased, and becoming even more generous in giving during this period.

#### **TOP 6 LIST**

- 1. Life group every Wednesday. Bible study group where we gather via Zoom and study from the book of Acts. Regular attendance 8-10 people.
- 2. Early morning prayer meeting every Wednesday. This is a combined ministry with Grace Japanese Christina Church in Banff, where we meet on online every Wednesday morning. Regular attendance 9-12.
- 3. Kids school (Poppo), every Sunday afternoon: kids from the age of 2-8 (5 kids regular attendance) gather together at the church.
- 4. Prayer Partner: this has been a new ministry since last September. 1 on 1 prayer partner groups that meet with their partners once every week to pray for each other and share their week.
- 5. Sunny Side Camp (Nikkei Christian Camp). Last year, we had a virtual sunny side camp with all Japanese churches in Canada, and with the advantage of Zoom, some of the people could join the camp from Japan and the US.
- 6. Young adults' group: young adults' group meets once every month at various locations both indoor and outdoor. The purpose of this group is to establish relationships and to share their faith.

#### **Praise Report**

Here is some updates: Over the past 4 months, God has been so gracious in many ways, and especially it is great to see some of families who left the church during the pandemic have started coming back and attending regularly. Another praise report is that one of congregants who was totally burnt out over the past 2 years, completely recovered last month, and started coming back to worship team again. Although, there are still a lot of challenges that we need to overcome as a church, there are some positive changes which have been taken place over the past 4 months, and we truly see that God has been/is working in our midst to heal and restructure this church. Please continue to pray for Crossover Church as we walk through some spiritual challenges that we have never seen before, but we believe that God is going to do something greater in our community and in areas that we are involved with.

- 3. We maintained our reduced class sizes to comply with Alberta Government regulations, down from 16 to 12 spots in our 3-year-old class and down from 18 to 14 in our 4-year-old class.
- 4. Enrollment was good with 9 out of 12 for our 3-year-old class and our 4-year-old class was full, 14 out of 14 spots filled.
- 5. Praise be to God, our staff and students remained healthy, and we did not have any cases of COVID-19 and did not have to close our preschool at any time during the year.
- 6. We continue to be blessed with our preschool space upstairs, gym access for cold days, and a wonderful place to play outside.
- 7. We appreciated the reduction in rent payment to the church to help mitigate lost enrollment income.
