





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

10. Discussion on Possible New Outreach Ministries

- a. *Every parish needs to have some good programs to reach out into the world to help others.*
- b. *The sandwich program is now being taken care of by the Food Bank. Julie Halfnights suggested we do not assume the sandwich ministry being taken over by the food bank as a permanent situation. Roberta reassured Julie that she has already has spoken to the food bank and they have assured her that they are continuing with this program. Jim Greatbanks agrees with Julie that the sandwich program connects the parish participants. He would like to see us working on seniors' initiatives.*
- c. *Sharmila talked about Mamas to Mamas in Richmond. They help single mothers in Richmond with supplies that they need. Food bank provides hampers for these single moms but these products expire within 5 days. They have a program called feeding dinners for single moms. The parish would make a dinner once a week and the mothers come and pick up the dinner for their children. Start with 10 to 15 mothers and make*

dinners for those mothers. Make the dinner and buy salad bag in bulk. Mary Koehler asked about allergies. We would have that information available on each family. Sharmila will create a task with force Kathy Duncan, Mary Koehler and Caroline to look at options and ideas to explore possibilities

- d. *Ivy Choung: if we cook the food in the church, it cannot be frozen right away. Roberta these details would have to be looked at by task force.*

11. Update on Interim Ministry/Search for new Rector

- a. *Caroline Burgess gave an update. The parish profile is now with graphic designer as requested by Diocese. It should be back in 2 weeks and then it will be posted on the Diocese website for 6 weeks. St Anne's should have a new priest by the end of summer 2021.*

Rectors' report submitted by The Rev. Marnie Peterson

I want to begin this report with gratitude. Since my arrival at St. Anne's on September 15th, there have been many people who have helped to orient me to this community. And for over two years now, it has taken several people to help keep the ministry and life going here at St. Anne's. In particular I want to thank the warden's, Noel Eaton, Roger Farrier and Ivy Cheung, who with Roberta, provided leadership in the interim and have been gracious about receiving many emails and fielding many questions from me.

And I want to thank the members of parish council, who have continued to meet monthly to attend to the business of our congregation and have helped me to better understand how St. Anne's organizes itself.

I am grateful to Sharmila Lakhani who has continued to lead the charge and all of the sandwich makers who have continued to ensure that our sandwich ministry continues despite restrictions and safety protocols, so that over 100 sandwiches are made and delivered to students in our local school.

Thank you to Rae Seay who works hard to organize our flower ministry and who, with Glenna McNaught, Loraine Farrier and Sharmila Lakhani, Ivy Cheung and Maureen Liew, purchase and arrange the flowers in our church for Sunday services, funerals and weddings, etc. This team of people work hard to ensure that the flowers are beautifully and thoughtfully arranged and are a lovely addition to our sanctuary.

Thank you to Jim Greatbanks, Neville Kim Sing and Jim Riley, who work hard to ensure that our building is maintained and well cared for.

Thank you to the AV team headed by Noel Eaton, and team members: Caroline Burgess, Gabriel Pestano, Jacky Kwok, Jim Huang and Jasmine Der, who take care of the power point and zoom broadcast in the church. And thank you to the online hosts, Gail Newell and Brigitte Solomon who help those who join by Zoom to participate fully. Thank you to the online attendance takers Sara Miller and Rae Seay, and Don Paul who organizes that team.

Thank you to the in-person greeters: Jean Ambeault, George Ing, Maureen Liew and Harold Shury, who check people in as they come and ensure that we all have what we need to participate fully in the liturgy.

Thank you to members of the altar guild in particular Merlyn Riley and Marie Middleton who have come in and organized, polished and shown me where things are in the sacristy. Thank you, in particular to Marie who cleans and irons the linens for us, now that we have returned to weekly Eucharist.

Thank you to everyone who helps with the liturgy. Sacristans: Bob McGall, Carline Burgess, Tony Herbert and Brigitte Solomon. Servers: Wesley, James, Clare, Natalie and Olivia. Thank you to all of the readers and intercessors.

Thank you to the members of our choir and in particular to Sarah Stevenson and Rachel Eaton who have served as soloists these past few weeks while we have had to restrict our singers. We look forward to having the full choir back very soon.

Thank you to the Rev's Gail Newel and Gladys Olsen for their willingness to help orient me and have offered much needed listening and feedback – and to Gail in particular for jumping in to preside and preach when I have been unable.

It is very possible that I have missed others, though I tried not to, who have offered leadership, observations, and who have pitched in as needed since my arrival.
Thank you.

Sadly, we have not been able to have any large community gatherings, which would have been ideal for meeting everyone. So, my first few months have really been focused on getting to know this community on a smaller scale. I have so far been able to have telephone conversations with many of you and some of you I managed to visit before visiting was discouraged in this latest wave of the pandemic.

Thought before things shifted again, it was great to be able to have the Christmas/Winter fair. From gathering with a small group to make apple pies to be sold, to setting up through to the actual sale, it was a lovely opportunity to be in the same room together. And the sale itself was a complete success. It was great to see and meet some of our neighbours, it was great to be together and we were able to raise some funds for the ministry of our church. Thank you to everyone who came together to help make it happen, particularly Caroline Burgess and Barb Hebert for their leadership.

I am incredibly grateful for all of the work that was done in the sanctuary and with technology which enables us to have a beautiful worship space and the ability to offer a combined in-person and Zoom worship each week. It has been important for this community to keep this practice and I anticipate that this will continue to be the way for us, regardless of restrictions on worship.

My first Advent and Christmas seasons here lovely. It was good to meet with a group in person and one online to study Walter Brueggeman's Advent study: Names for the Messiah. Christmas eve we joined with Gilmore Park United to offer a children's service at 4pm and then two Communion services at 7 and 10pm. There was no Christmas day service.

As noted in my list of gratitude above, St. Anne's has been able to continue with many of the ministries that began pre-pandemic. It has been important for us to continue to find ways to connect both to each other and to the wider community through these last few years.

While I would love to consider what else we might do to grow our ministry, I believe that before we can do that, we will need to focus on re-building. You will notice that in the budget we have added a budget line for capacity building. This is because I am hopeful that we will soon move to a new phase of COVID, in which we learn to live with it, rather than escape from it.

I am hopeful that as the warmer weather begins, we will be able to consider ways that we might once more begin to gather. After almost three years of being told to stay apart, I suspect that we will need some practice feeling comfortable coming together again. So I would like to plan community gatherings that are not fundraisers, but rather opportunities for re-connecting and relationship building.

As I look ahead with our parish leadership into 2022, I believe that our focus should be rebuilding St. Anne's. So, I, with them and you, will be looking for ways that we can come together, to celebrate, to deepen our faith and our congregational life, together.

Warden's Report

When 2021 began, St. Anne's was still in the midst of restrictions that would not allow in-person worship. Our response was to expand our Zoom presence, utilizing the audio visual equipment installed in 2020 to stream our services live. Over the course of the year, and adhering to the guidelines set forth by the Provincial authorities and the Diocesan leadership, we gradually opened our doors to welcome back those parishioners who felt comfortable returning to in-person worship, as well as new seekers.

St. Anne's has also committed to continuing to offer online service in a model that allows us to be together live, both in the sanctuary and on Zoom. While we are still overcoming the occasional technical hurdle, this hybrid form of worship is enabling us to grow our congregation and to reach friends and neighbors that we could not have previously embraced. Anyone who is feeling ill or who is not yet comfortable sitting in the pews can remain at home while still joining us in fellowship, prayer, and song.

Our search committee spent many long hours interviewing candidates to become the permanent rector of St. Anne's. The task was not an easy one, and the members of the Search Committee showed their grace and their commitment to the ministry of St. Anne's by the care and seriousness with which they deliberated. In August, St. Anne's said goodbye to the Reverend Roberta Frasier, who had led and served us well for over 2 years as interim rector. In September we welcomed the Reverend Marnie Peterson as the new permanent rector. We look forward to many years of service under her compassionate care.

While 2021 did not follow the course we had expected, the path that God set for us has shown that St. Anne's will grow and flourish in the years to come.

St. Anne's Church Sandwich Program

We commenced our lunch program at St. Anne's church in September 2021. Initially we started the lunch program four days per week (Monday through to Thursday) and after three weeks we increased it to five days per week. The lunches are prepared following Covid and Food Safe guidelines by parishioners of St. Anne's along with community volunteers. The Richmond Food Bank continues to provide us with food supplies for the sandwiches/wraps.

When we started the lunch program we made sandwiches/wraps for five schools (Grauer elementary school, Hugh Boyd secondary school, McKay elementary school, Manoah Steeves elementary school, and McNair secondary school). As of January 2022 we have now added Cook elementary school to our lunch program.

We make 118 sandwiches/wraps Monday through Thursday and on Fridays we have 78 sandwiches as we do not deliver sandwiches to McNair Secondary school on Fridays. It takes approximately two hours to prepare and deliver the sandwiches to the various schools.

I would like to thank all the volunteers (Glenna McNaughton, Barb Herbert, Blanche Kishi, Boni Parker, Baryl Mackelson, Wilma Santos, Rosemary Webster, Linda Meiswer, Harold Shury, Staci Hayashi, Grace Rathwell, Rae Seay, Mary Koehler, Gail Newell, Bev Glaser, Cindy Gold, Merle Riley Tish Pearce, and Jerome Ming) for supporting and making this program a success while helping to provide lunches to all these children.

Counter's Report

2021 in St. Anne's continued to be much like 2020. As was the case after March 2020, each Sunday the offerings that had come in that week were blessed by Roberta (and then Marnie) during the Zoom service. The offerings were then held in the Church safe until after the last Sunday of the month.

For the first eight or nine months of 2021, I found that continuing to count the collection once a month was sufficient as we had a hybrid system with very few people worshipping in person with the great majority on Zoom. Most parishioners did their envelope offering once or twice a month.

After that last Sunday of each month, Tish Pearce and I met in the Church to "count the collection". The routine is to record each Sunday's envelope offerings and open donations, as indicated by each donor, and bank the receipts.

In September, I decided there were enough offerings to warrant counting the collection twice a month, usually after the second and last Sundays. I will continue to monitor the offerings and, with Rev. Marnie, decide when we need to add another team to count more frequently.

The Counters' work is an important part of the administration of St. Anne's and is greatly valued and appreciated. Many thanks once again to Tish Pearce for helping me in this. I hope it won't be too long until we are all comfortable to be back worshipping in the Church and doing a more frequent count.

Building Maintenance Annual Report

We are gradually getting back to normal after the major repairs and upgrades of 2020-2021. But maintenance is something that has to be done on a regular basis. We owe it to all those members, who do such a wonderful job at performing the many roles to keep St. Annes alive and well. Thanks again to all who helped keep our Church looking and performing well, with all the changes and constructions going on. Neville and Jim watched the pro's in action, a fine bunch of men who performed well under Jim Greatbanks.

On the home front, we thank those who stepped forward to keep their work area in good condition: from those using the kitchen, the flower guild and all others involved in the Church operations. We appreciate the assistance of Noel Eaton and family as well.

We are still challenged by clogged drains on the roof (leaves etc) and this requires physical inspections from time to time. The grease trap under the kitchen sink has been cleaned out and an improvement is noted, since we no longer empty large food scraps into that facility. The trap is rather ancient and will have to be replaced sometime down the line.

We are fortunate in having a renter, Peter Friesen as he is a valuable asset in afterhours assessing problems from within and also clearing the entrance way of leaves and/ or snow. He has assisted with some of our building projects when required.

Neville keeps the Boilers for Heat and Hot Water running and other technical electrical matters. We get together for other projects like damaged items and other necessary repairs reported to him or office personnel. A monthly inspection of the safety and security lighting system is also performed. The irrigation system is opened and closed seasonally for the gardens and lawns.

Lastly, Neville Kim Sing has carried the load in the last months because of an at home accident affecting Jim Riley. Hopefully he will resume light duties, but if there is anyone to assist Neville, please let him or the wardens know.

We provide our own tools and are able to beg or borrow any necessary equipment and technology. Jim Greatbanks provided some tools and a work bench, which was greatly appreciated.

2022 – Motion to allow same-gender marriage

In May 2008, the parish of St. Annes' gathered for a special vestry meeting to discuss a motion to allow same-sex blessing and with a clear majority passed the following:

Be it resolved:

“That this parish of St. Anne’s – Steveston is a place where the blessing of same-sex unions may occur and that, if the Rector concurs, the bishop be asked to give permission that these blessings may be conducted.”

Following the failed vote to change the marriage canon in 2019, Archbishop Melissa wrote the following in a pastoral letter to the clergy of the Diocese of New Westminster:

As of August 1, 2019, I will authorize a liturgy for the marriage of same-sex couples within the Diocese of New Westminster under the following conditions:

- that the priest wishing to officiate at the marriage make a request of me to use that liturgy and work in consultation with me in preparing to conduct that liturgy. I specify this in that I want us all to learn together as we gain experience in working with this new liturgy and in preparing same-sex couples for the sacrament of marriage.
- that the Parish Council of any church hosting or wanting to host the marriage of same-sex couples concur with and embrace the decision for same-sex marriages to occur there, and
- that any same-sex couple wishing to be married satisfy all the typical and important requirements for marriage (proper preparation for marriage, at least one of the couple having been baptized, that the marriage take place in a church or another public place).

In an effort to clarify our position as a parish and in accordance with the permissions granted by our Bishop.

Be it resolved

That the parish of St. Anne’s- Steveston is a place where same-sex marriages may be offered and officiated.
