THE GATHERING OF THE COMMUNITY

At communion time, please remain in your seat and the celebrant will bring communion to you, in a safe manner which conforms to the provincial and diocesan protocols.)

Leader: As we meet today, we begin by remembering the Songhees and Esquimalt nations, on whose traditional land we now gather in gratitude. We acknowledge their story and their stewardship of the land and water, the plants, and animals, through the many generations.

As we meet today, we remember those who have called this place their home in recent years—the community of faith known as Church of the Advent. Let us greet one another with words and signs of welcome.

From many places and peoples we come to this house in prayer.

In this time and space heaven and earth are one.

In this time and space we are not alone, but one in Christ.

Knit together in the unity of the Spirit.
