Palm Sunday - Bishop Al Gwinn

Bishop Gwinn has served churches ranging from rural, inner city, and suburban congregations. For ten years he served as the Senior Pastor of the Centenary United Methodist Church in Lexington, Kentucky, which under his leadership became the largest church in that Conference. He also served as the District Superintendent of the Lexington District. He was elected to the Episcopacy in 2004 and served as the Bishop of the North Carolina Conference based in Raleigh.

Dr. Welborn is a Professor of New Testament and Early Christianity at Fordham University in New York City. "For years I have felt called to compose a choral work for Maundy Thursday. Each year, in the days leading up to Easter, I am reminded of the incredible, powerful story that is the selfless sacrifice of Jesus for all. I think of those who were there ... I consider how they might have felt as they interacted with Jesus on his journey to the cross. In 2019, I took these reflections and created this work which I am happy to finally be able to share. A New Commandment is a 7-movement cantata for choir and orchestra that brings to life the perspectives of those characters in new ways, through monologue and song. It is my hope that through this music and drama, we might find ourselves in this story, in a more intimate way than before." -Kevin S. Foster, Composer

Spring A Sweet Season of Renewal

Hello friends. The other day I heard spring defined as "A Sweet Season of Renewal." I like that, don't you? What a refreshing way to think about this time of year. I know many of us can't wait until March 20 to celebrate

the new season. Poets, theologians, and writers of all kinds have had much to say about springtime through the years. All you have to do is look within to find your favorite definition. I like the phrase describing the beauty of new flowers and vegetation as "floral apostles" beautifully directing our thoughts to "Jesus the one source of divine Life and Love in whom we find salvation from sin, darkness and death." Another writer proclaims the leaves "clapping their hands as nature's untired worshipers." This reminds me of the Scripture from Luke 19:40 where Jesus expresses to the Pharisees that they are powerless to stop the excitement of the people and that if humanity did stop "I tell you....if they keep quiet even the stones will cry out." The idea of rocks crying out in praise to the Lord is poetic, startling imagery. Throughout the Bible we find similar poetic passages that present a host of objects praising God. For example in Psalm 114:6, the mountains leap and in Psalm 148, the sun, moon, stars, heavens, water, sky, animals, and people "Praise the Lord." This is the ultimate purpose of everything and evervone in existence.

In saying the "stones will cry out," Jesus is indicating that the people's acclamations of joy and faith should be encouraged. The people of Jerusalem are expressing great joy and that joy and positive faith is so necessary and so appropriate that if they did not express this kind of praise, inanimate objects would fill the void. Colossians 1:16 reminds us that all creation declares God's praise. We are a part of that creation. In fact, as humans created in God's image we should be leading the band of those who celebrate and praise the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

So this spring as the sun warms your face and the breeze caresses your hair and thoughts of new life fill your mind... take the time to thank God for His presence. Then allow the praise that is innate within you to flow from your heart through your mouth with a "Thank you, Lord."

We are currently experiencing the Season of Lent which will lead quickly to Holy Week and the life changing message of Easter. As we allow ourselves to truly experience this spring of hope, we will be in a great position to receive the meaningfulness of Easter.

HAWKINS STEMM ACADEMY

Two Epworth-Hawkins Partnership Book Initiatives programs, Reader Bags and Book Clubs, that were suspended during the 2020-21 school year have resumed in 2022. First and second grade students are again able to borrow two age-appropriate books for a week at a time. When books are returned, Epworth volunteers check them in and provide students with a new bag of books to borrow. In March, book clubs for small groups of 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students will restart. Participants are selected by teachers, who also recommend books that are then purchased by the Epworth Hawkins Partnership. Book Initiative volunteers lead weekly ½ hour discussions during students' lunch/recess time. In May, the Book Initiatives team will again hold Kindergarten Book Day, providing each kindergarten student with a new hardcover book. Book Initiatives volunteers also assist in staffing the school library two days a week, every other week. These programs promote the BI goal of putting books into the hands and homes of Hawkins students, with a focus on grades K-5.
