FIRST READING: GENESIS 15:1-12, 17-18

A reading from Genesis.

After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?"

³ And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir."

⁴ But the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." ⁵ He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶ And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

7 Then he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." ⁸ But he said, "O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" 9 He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two.

¹¹ And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.


¹²As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

Purpose, Mission, Vision, Values

Historically, Lent has been a time of instruction for those preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil. Many Lutherans around the world, including St. Peter's, have reviewed the basics of our faith by using The Small Catechism of Martin Luther during the season of Lent.

What is mission?


Mission is the work of disciples who have been called into God's purpose.

What does Scripture say to us about Grace?

⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. (Ephesians 2:8-9) This is most certainly true.

What is hope?

Hope is the faith that in all things, all times, all challenges, all joys, all sorrows, and all celebrations hope lives in us through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

What does Scripture say to us about hope?

According to [God's] great mercy, [God] has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading.... (1 Peter 1:3-7)

This is most certainly true.

What is love?

Love is the patient, kind, humble, truthful, enduring gift of God that bears all things, hopes all things, and endures all things without end. (1 Corinthians 13)

What more does Scripture say about love?

"... because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God...for God is love... if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us." (1 John 4:7; 8b; 12b)

This is most certainly true.

How do we: Grow Grace?

We grow Grace when we forgive as we have been forgiven, love as Jesus loves us, live in peace with our neighbor, and seek God's blessing for all persons regardless of merit or offense.

How do we: Live Hope?


We live Hope when we faithfully live in the hope of Jesus' resurrection, remembering that death has been conquered through him, and that we are united with him in Holy Baptism. How do we: Serve Love?

We serve Love knowing that God is love, that God's love is poured out for all creation, so that as we love those around us through patience, kindness, endurance, and humility we serve God. This is most certainly true.
















C: receive our prayer.

P/A: You hear us when we cry to you. Attend to those expecting a child, and console those who have experienced miscarriage. Comfort veterans enduring post-traumatic stress. Shield those endangered by domestic violence. Uphold those who are ill or grieving (especially). Merciful God,

C: receive our prayer.

P/A: You kindle faith that moves us into action. Guide children and adults preparing for baptism or confirmation. Empower Sunday school teachers, confirmation leaders, and parents who share their faith with younger generations. Give us all a renewed sense of vocation. Merciful God,

C: receive our prayer.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

P/A: You welcome us into your heavenly realm. We give thanks for those whose labors on earth are ended and who now rest with you. On the final day, gather all of us, with them, in your loving arms. Merciful God,

C: receive our prayer.

P: Accept the prayers we bring, O God, on behalf of a world in need, for the sake of Jesus Christ.





C: Amen.







It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ.

With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever.
