Parish Events

WE'RE DELIGHTED ONCE AGAIN TO HAVE THE OPTION OF MEETING TOGETHER IN-PERSON FOR OUR SUNDAY WORSHIP! The Province and Diocese have lifted restrictions on gathering size, all need for registering, and all restrictions on congregational singing. Masking is still strongly recommended by the Diocese and Parish Council. Physical distancing is still being maintained. Services will continue to be live-streamed.

Sunday School Resources for Sunday School at home from the National Church are posted weekly on our website. To access them, please type "Sunday School" in the search box, and click on "Sunday School". A 4 question Survey about Sun. School has been sent out to households with Sunday School-age children. Everyone's asked to please complete and email it back ASAP. If you've children/grandchildren who might come to Sunday School, and you haven't received a Survey, please let Fergus know.

Sunday Coffee Time: Our in-person post-Service Coffee Time has resumed! We're sticking to coffee, tea and juice only during Lent. If you're able to help with our Coffee Time, please contact the Parish Office.

Our Virtual Coffee Time is continuing on Sundays via Zoom, but has been moved 15 min. later to 11:45. The Zoom link, which is unchanged, is in the Order of Service, under the Sermon tab of our website.

Daily Devotional Booklets for Lent are available just inside the main entrance. Please help yourself.
